The custom made green and yellow-swirled cones with green and yellow sprinkles reflect the silks colors of Donegal Racing. The offer is available at The Dairy Haus at 476 Maple Avenue in Saratoga Springs, NY from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m., while supplies last.

Fans will once again have the opportunity to have their photo taken with the Man OøWar Cup at the Community Outreach Booth on Thursday, September 3 from 1 to 3 p.m. with a \$5 donation to benefit Siena College. Siena Athletics will also bring the MAAC Championship Trophy for a
