• The Travers: It Travers Day at Saratoga Race Course with a special first post time of 11:35 a.m. Gates open at 7 a.m. for the 144th running of the Grade 1, \$1 million Travers, the oldest major stakes race for 3-year-olds in the nation. This year Mid-Summer Derby is poised to feature a showdown between the nation top 3-year-old thoroughbreds of 2013 Kentucky Derby winner Orb, Belmont Stakes winner Palace Malice and Haskell winner Verrazano.
