Members of the New York State Legislature

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund Corporation, I am pleased to present this annual report for 2023. This report contains information regarding revenue, award payments, research funding and promotional spends made by the Fund during the year.

The performances of registered NY-breds on racetracks and at auction houses, as well as their consistent foal crops, demonstrate that the Fund is fulfilling the mission established for it by the NYS Legislature in 1973.

Mission Statement: To promote by monetary incentives the responsible breeding of quality Thoroughbred race horses in keeping with the founding legislation to preserve New York's irreplaceable farmland.

The Fund collects revenue from the racing industry and from video gaming machines located at Thoroughbred racetracks in the state. The Fund returns approximately 87% of revenue to its stakeholders in the form of awards, purse enrichment for NY-breds and support for equine research. This demonstrates that the Fund and its programs contribute to the strength of the state's breeding and racing industries and therefore to the state economy.

Executive Review

Half a century after the NYS Legislature created the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund Corporation, the programs it oversees make it the envy of every other regional program in North America. This has been accomplished through the hard work of people on both the state's farms and racetracks, and through the wise guidance of the Fund's Board of Directors, in accordance with its mission statement:

“To promote by monetary incentives the responsible breeding of quality Thoroughbred racehorses in keeping with the founding legislation to preserve New York's irreplaceable farmland.”

The year was full of opportunities and challenges, as Governor Hochul and lawmakers backed a \$455 million makeover of Belmont Park to ensure that the home of the third leg of the Triple Crown would reside in a “right-sized” racing facility in the future. Plans show that the reimagined track will provide the safest racing surfaces possible in a venue that's more suited to modern-day race crowds, with racing supporters increasingly watching and betting on the sport from their computer or handheld device.

The state's first female governor enhanced her reputation as a friend to horses by supporting a slaughter bill that protects all breeds in the state from selling to “kill buyers.” This is a reflection of racing and breeding interests increasingly recognizing that the social contract that permits racing must promise racehorses the safest possible experience on the track and a good life afterward.

So it's with pride that the Fund in 2023 surpassed the million-dollar mark in promotional spending with thoroughbred aftercare facilities in the state, which help racehorses transition to second careers or provide for their care within the protection of equine sanctuaries.

A high compliment to the Fund's breeding programs was the announcement by NYRA in October that it would provide purse parity with open-company races for two-year-olds in NY-bred races beginning with the foal crop of 2024.

The New York Racing Association announced: “Beginning January 1, 2026, New York-bred overnight races for 2-year-olds on the NYRA circuit will offer purse amounts matching the race's open-company counterpart (19% purse increase from 2023). Accordingly, the 2024 New York-bred foal crop will gain the benefits and financial rewards that will flow from purse parity.”

At the 2023 summer meet at Saratoga Race Course, maiden races restricted to New York-bred 2-year-olds featured a purse of \$88,000 compared to a purse of \$105,000 offered for 2-year-olds competing in an open-company maiden event.

While this purse increase will impact only the 2024 New York-bred foal crop, NYRA intends to further expand purse parity for additional categories of New York-bred races in the future.

In 2023, NYRA demonstrated its support for NY-breds by conducting 514 races exclusively for horses registered with the NY Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, and provided more than \$38 million in purse money for those races. Among them were 56 stakes with \$8,725,000 in purse money on offer. NYRA holds three high-profile NY-bred showcase days annually, highlighted by New York Showcase Day at Saratoga Race Course. In 2023, Saratoga Showcase Day was run on the Sunday of Travers Weekend and featured more than 100 NY-breds competing in 11 races, including six stakes worth a combined \$1.25 million.

In December 2023, the Fund Board decided to adjust breeder awards to reward those that produce quality thoroughbreds. This is the new breeder-award structure:

New York-Sired*

Award (Percent of Purse Money Earned)

- First Place: **40%**
- Second Place: **20%**
- Third Place: **10%**
- Cap per Award: **\$40,000**

Non-New York-Sired*

Award (Percent of Purse Money Earned)

- First Place: **20%**
- Second Place: **10%**
- Third Place: **5%**
- Cap per Award **\$20,000**

* A New York-sired New York-bred is sired by a registered New York stallion. A non-New York-sired New York-bred is sired by an out-of-state stallion or an unregistered New York stallion.

These are some of the factors that have led to the New York breeding programs being recognized as “the premier state-bred program in the United States” by Boyd Browning, President of Fasig-Tipton.

The programs run by the NYTBDF can boast that in 2023:

- Six NY-breds won nine graded stakes races, including two Grade 1 stakes.
- The New York foal crop experienced only a slight decline in the face of steep declines across the industry, with NY breeders putting 1446 foals on the ground.
- The Fund illustrated its respect for and commitment to ex-racehorses by passing the million-dollar mark in support for thoroughbred aftercare via promotional spends with thoroughbred retirement facilities and re-training venues in New York State.
- The Zweig Fund again benefited from near-record contributions from the Fund, which provides 60% of the Zweig Fund’s revenue.

The combination of over \$40 million in restricted purse money, plentiful chances to race in restricted company, and an enviable awards program have made NY-breds a must-own for any racing stable.

GRADED STAKES

Perhaps the most important illustration of their improved quality is how well NY-breds perform at the open-company stakes level. New York-breds had another outstanding year in 2023, with Red Knight winning the G1

the Man o' War Stakes at Belmont Park and Therapist taking the G1 United Nations Handicap at Monmouth Park.

STALLIONS

New York's 2023 stallion roster boasted 40 stallions, including seven new to the Empire State:

NY-BREDS AT AUCTION IN 2023

The auction results for New York-breds in 2023 can be characterized quite simply as “correction without contraction.”

In 2023, for the third time in the VLT era (2011 forward), the New York-bred bloodstock market followed a blockbuster, record-breaking year (2022) with an organic market correction. This is the third iteration of a pattern that has emerged during a period of overall growth and expansion in the New York breeding program (2011-2023).

Against the backdrop of the two other instances of this phenomenon (2015-2016 and 2018-2019), the correction of 2023 does not raise any red flags. It is far less dramatic than the first correction, and comparable to the second. Moreover, even though 2023 could not match the lofty heights of 2022, sales results across all three sectors were solid in 2023, and in some cases strong. As will be seen in the overview and sector-by-sector analyses to be found later in this report, the key indicators for 2023, for the most part, rank among the top two, three or four historical highs.

Finally, it is noteworthy that the market correction of 2023 was *not* accompanied by market contraction. On the contrary, a record number of New York-breds successfully changed hands at public auction in 2023. This is part and parcel of a steady upward trend. Both 2021 and 2022 saw record numbers of New York-breds sold at North American auctions (924 and 946, respectively). In 2023 the total was 1010, topping four digits for the first time. This is the mark of a healthy bloodstock market.

BECOMING A NEW YORK-BRED

For the third year in a row, breeders were able to take advantage of two significant changes in Fund rules regarding mare residency.

First, any non-resident mare purchased at public auction for \$50,000 or more is now allowed to come to the state within two weeks of the end of that auction and deliver the foal she's carrying. Rather than having to be bred back to a NY stallion as would normally be required of a non-resident mare, she is then allowed to go out of state to be covered, but must return to the state within 120 days of her last cover and have a second NY foal.

Both foals will then be eligible to be registered as NY-breds. If she fails to produce a second foal in New York for whatever reason, the original foal can still be registered as a NY-bred but will be ineligible to earn breeder awards. In 2023 the Board amended the rule for mares purchased at sales abroad, allowing them 60 days from the last day of the sale to enter the state to foal.

Only Thoroughbreds registered by the Fund by virtue of meeting the residency and inspection requirements can be entered in NY-bred restricted races conducted at race meets held by the New York Racing Association and at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack. Similarly, only registered NY-breds can generate awards for their breeders and owners, and for owners of registered New York stallions. NY-breds can also run in any "open" races in the state and anywhere in the world.

Those who buy and own racehorses appreciate that with a NY-bred there will be more chances to earn money. Our horses can win a maiden race, any number of claiming races and two NY-bred restricted allowance races before turning around and running in the same allowance conditions against open company. That earnings potential, combined with the fact that NY-breds can do well wherever they compete, resulted once again in impressive numbers in the sales ring, as detailed later in this report.

As Tina Bond, President of the New York Thoroughbred Horseman's Association, has observed, "There has never been a better time to race and breed New York-breds."

REVENUE

For the tenth straight year, the Fund received the full statutory amount of 1.50% from VLTs operated at Resorts World Casino New York City. A review of financial statements will reveal that the Resorts World VLT payments now accounts for approximately 63% of Fund revenue.

AWARDS AND PURSE ENRICHMENT

As of this writing, the Fund expects to pay \$16.8 million to breeders, owners and stallion owners whose registered NY-bred horses finished first, second or third from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31, 2023 at New York tracks.

These awards help our stakeholders pay feed, veterinary and blacksmith bills, school and property taxes, and their employees. These and other spends made by our stakeholders, combined with dollars from equine pursuits led by Thoroughbred and Standardbred racing, contribute more than \$3 billion to the agricultural, entertainment, sporting and tourist segments of the state's economy.

The reader will find on our website the results of the 2022 Harry M. Zweig research report from Cornell University. When the 2023 Zweig report is published and provided to the Fund, we will update this annual report on our website to reflect the latest equine research performed at Cornell with the support of \$418,861 in 2023 from the Fund.

The 2023 report details NY-bred accomplishments on the racetrack and in the sales ring, and also provides a detailed accounting of the receipts and disbursements in the Breeding Fund's three incentive areas – breeder awards, stallion awards and open-company owner awards. Additionally, it contains an analysis of the impact of the New York State Thoroughbred breeding program. Also included is a brief review of the Fund's promotion and aftercare efforts.

Financial Review

Under founding statutes, the Fund receives revenue from on-track and off-track Thoroughbred handle in New York, and breakage from regional off-track wagers.

Total handle accounted for 21 percent and 23 percent of operating revenue in 2023 and 2022, respectively, while breakage accounted for 1.2 percent and 1.5 percent of operating revenue in 2023 and 2022, respectively.

The Fund obtained an additional contractual source of revenue from Video Lottery Terminals (VLTs) at Finger Lakes Gaming and Racetrack beginning in 2004, which provided approximately 8 percent and 7 percent of total operating revenue for 2023 and 2022, respectively. Further enhancing Fund revenues, Resorts World Casino New York City began operation of VLTs at Aqueduct Racetrack in late 2011. Statutory revenue received from this operation was approximately \$10.2 million in 2023 and \$9.5 million in 2022, or 49 percent and 47 percent of total operating revenue, respectively.

The VLT recapture for 2023 of \$2.7 million allows the Fund to maintain 2013 Resorts World VLT revenue levels adjusted for inflation, and resulted in a 69 percent combined percentage from all VLT revenue sources in 2023 versus 66 percent in 2022.

Effective January 1, 2014, legislation provided for the Fund to receive revenues from Advanced Deposit Wagering (ADW) sources. Total ADW revenue accounted for 8.5 percent and 8 percent of total operating revenue for 2023 and 2022, respectively. The total 2023 operating revenue of approximately \$20.9 million was approximately \$700,000 higher than the 2022 figure.

With this healthy revenue picture, the Fund was able to pay out 100% of all breeder, stallion and owner awards earned in 2023. The Fund also authorized a 24% supplemental award to all 2023 award earners and \$300,000 in purse enrichment specifically to support the New York Stallion Stakes Series conducted by the New York Racing Association. Also, these funds allowed the Board of Directors to provide an additional \$200,000 to the Finger Lakes to enhance purses for NY-bred runners during 2024.

By closely monitoring administration and promotional expenses, the Fund was able to remain below the statutory spending caps of 5 percent and 6 percent, respectively, in 2023. Administration expenses of \$625,676 represented 3 percent of total operating revenues in 2023. Promotional expenses of \$1,080,205 represented 5.2 percent of 2023 total operating revenues, and includes \$159,550 in promotional support for aftercare facilities or organizations in New York State. Statutes dictate that the Fund pays the Harry M. Zweig Memorial Fund of Cornell University 2 percent of its operating revenues to fund equine research. The amount payable to Cornell University for 2023 is \$418,861. The amount was \$405,292 in 2022.

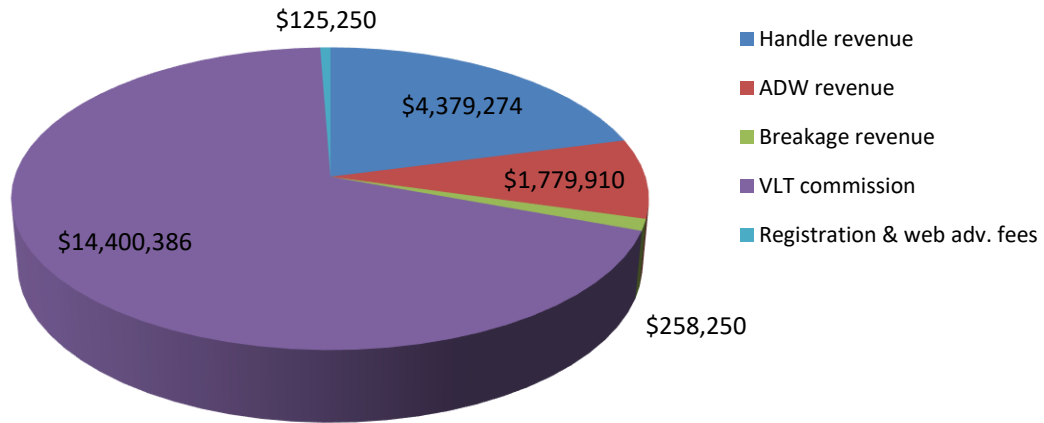

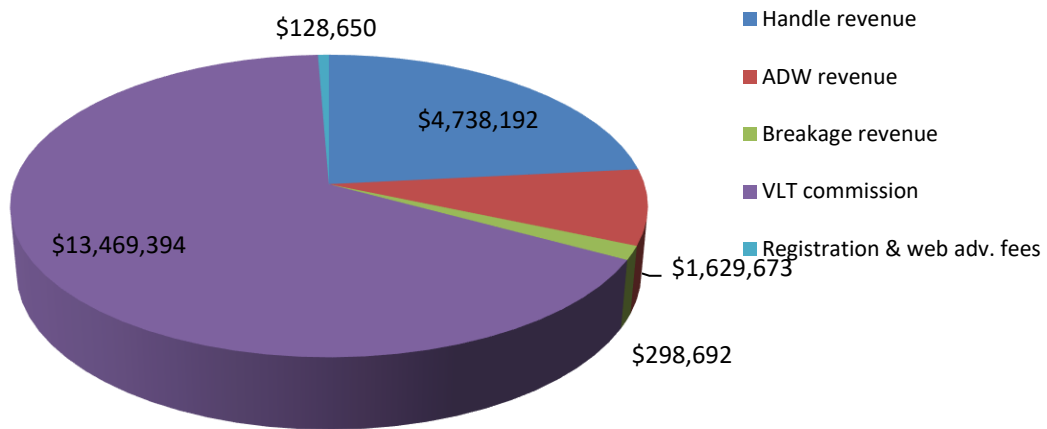

2023 Operating Revenues

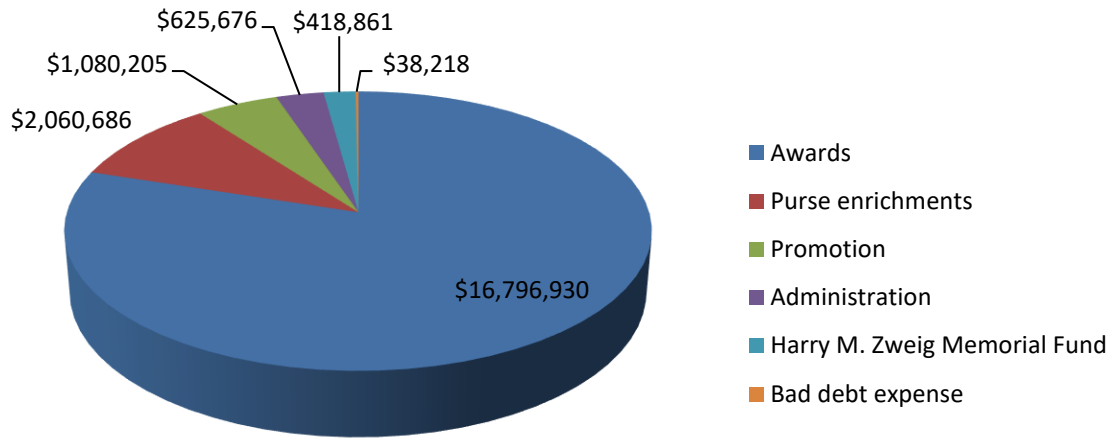


2022 Operating Revenues

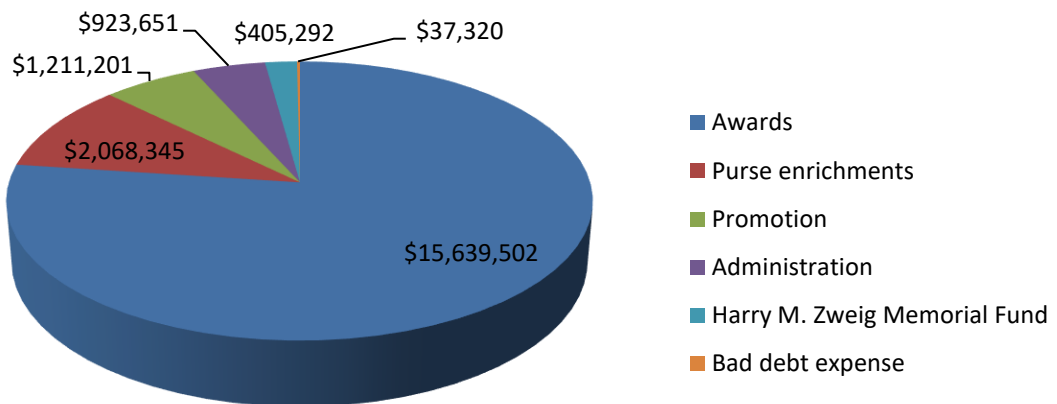

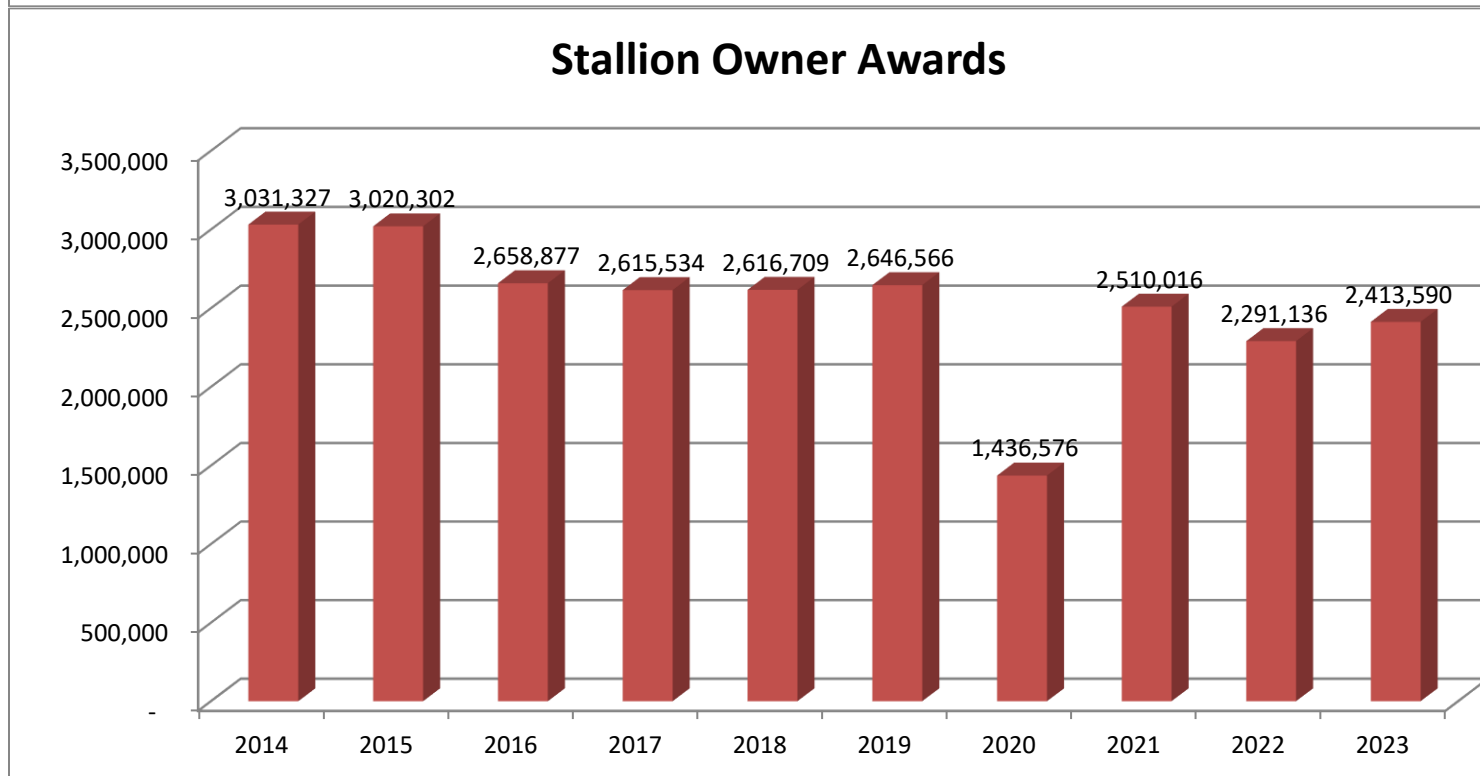
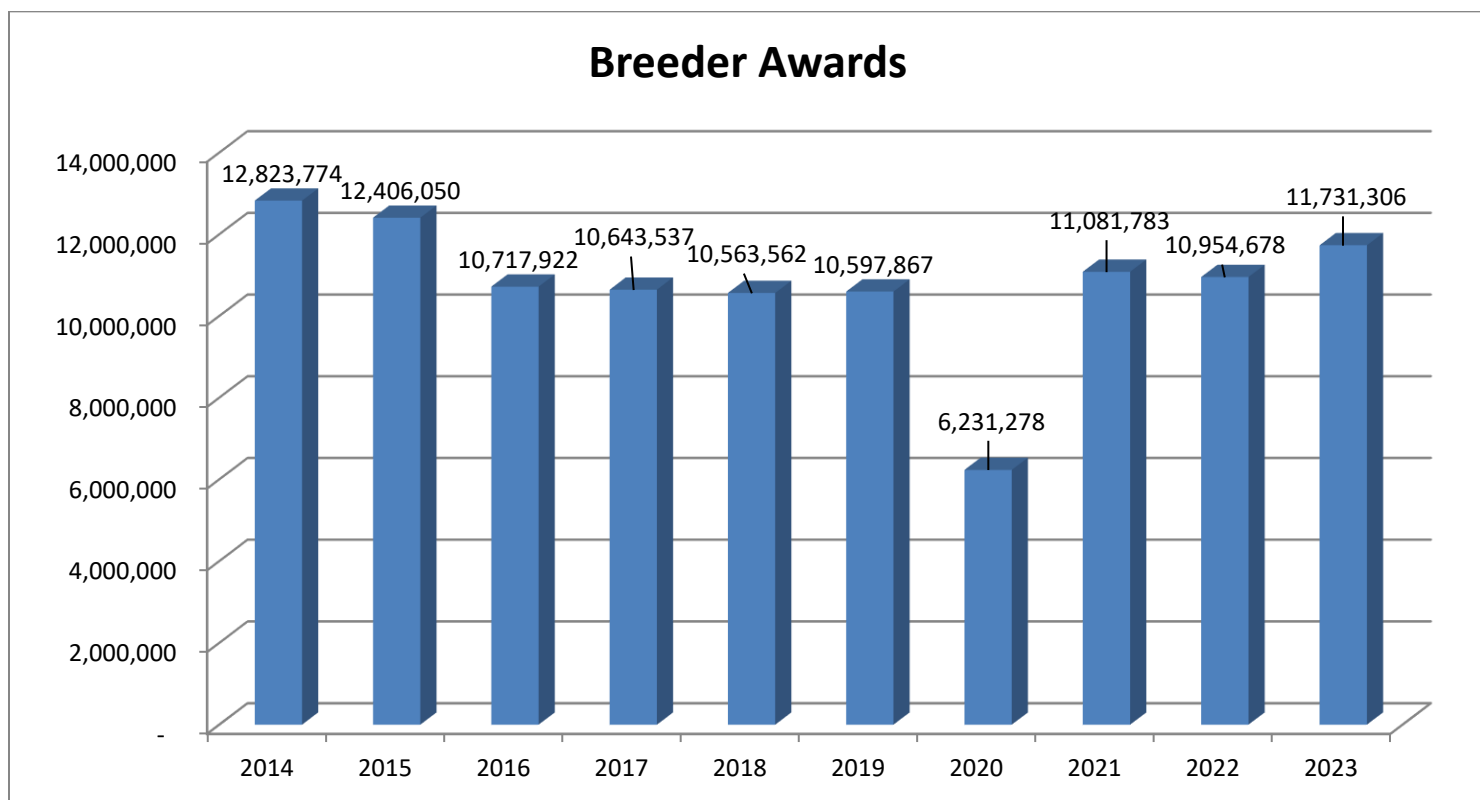
2023 Operating Expenses



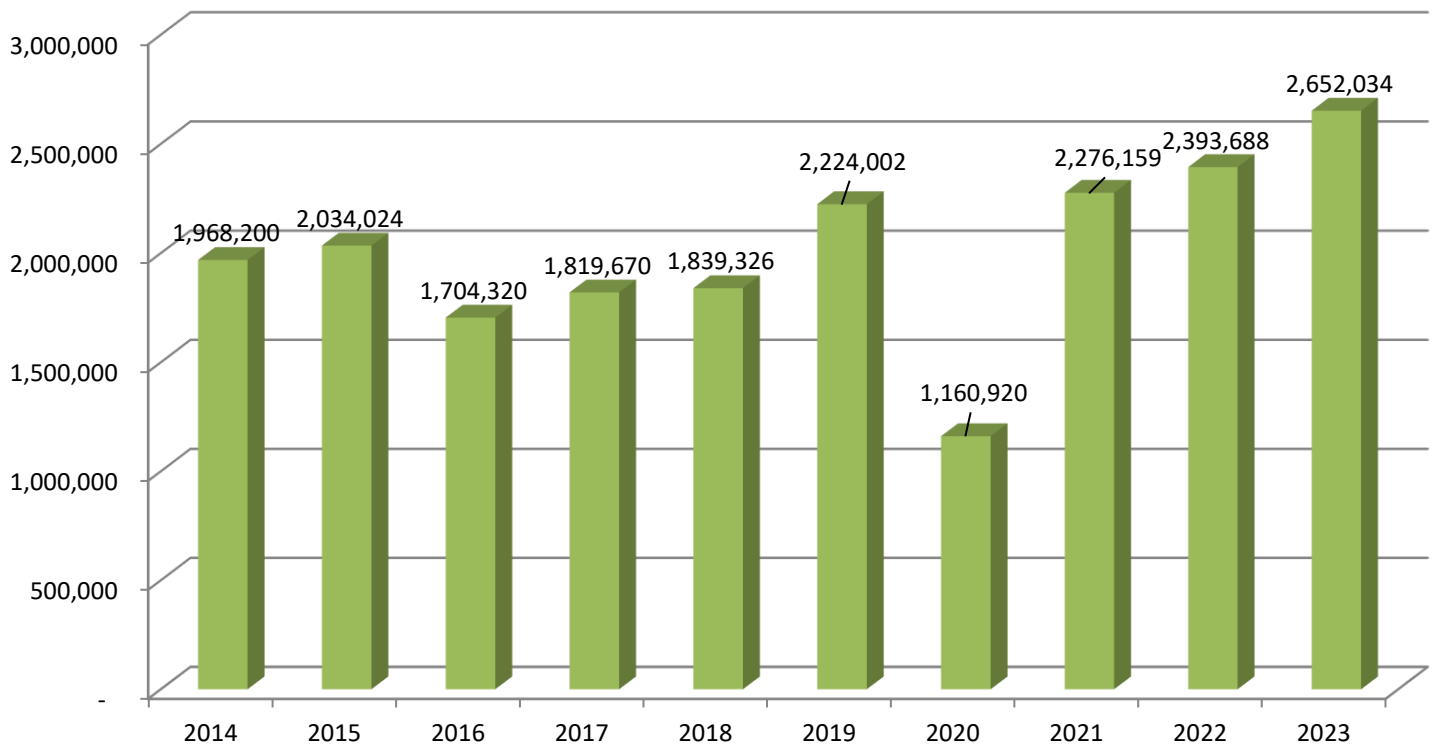
2022 Operating Expenses

Mares & Foals

Mares & Foals Report

The 2023 foaling season in New York saw a small drop-off in foal count, with 1446 foals delivered across the state. This figure is 54 fewer than the 2022 total, but it compares favorably to the broad picture of the North American foal count. The Jockey Club forecasts that the final foal count for 2023 in North America will be 18,500, with only 18,143 live foals reported as of October 2023. While the NY foal crop is still over 18% higher than the low of 1,225 foals seen in 2011, nationally the foal crop has fallen by over 19% during the same period.

According to The Jockey Club, the decline in the foal crop corresponds to the decline in the number of US races, which has fallen by 28% from 2010 to 2022. During the same period, the number of starters in US races has fallen by 34%.

Another obvious contributing factor to the reduction in the size of the foal crop is the fact that more than 40 racetracks have closed since 2000, and most remaining tracks are running fewer days each year. Even NYRA is operating on a reduced schedule and has been carding fewer than 600 NY-bred restricted races each year since 2020. Further, breeders across the board openly lament the flight of buyers to the most expensive thoroughbreds offered each year, and the resultant weakening of the middle market. However, as we note elsewhere in this report, NY-breds remain a desirable commodity.

One of the recent rule changes made by the Fund's Board of Directors allows non-resident mares purchased for \$50,000 or more to come to New York State within two weeks of a public auction to foal here. Rather than being required to breed back to a NY stallion as would normally be the case for a non-resident mare, these sale mares are allowed to then leave the state after foaling to visit the stallion of their owner's choice. She must then return to the state within 120 days of her last cover and have a second NY foal. Both foals will then be eligible to be registered as NY-breds, run in restricted races and earn breeder and owner awards. These rules were expanded in 2023 to allow more time for mares purchased abroad to reach New York State. Readers can find details at www.NYBreds.com under 'Mares' -> 'Resident and Non-Resident Mares.'

The 2023 foaling season saw a total of 97 new mares arrive from public sales. Of those, 39 were mares that sold for \$50,000 or more.

Since the \$50K+ sale-mare rule was implemented, 126 mares that sold for more than \$50,000 at public auction have come to New York State, with the majority remaining here to become resident mares.

The chart on the following page shows that, for the fifth year in a row, more New York foals were sired by out-of-state stallions (primarily in Kentucky) or non-registered stallions standing in NY than by stallions registered with the NY Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund.

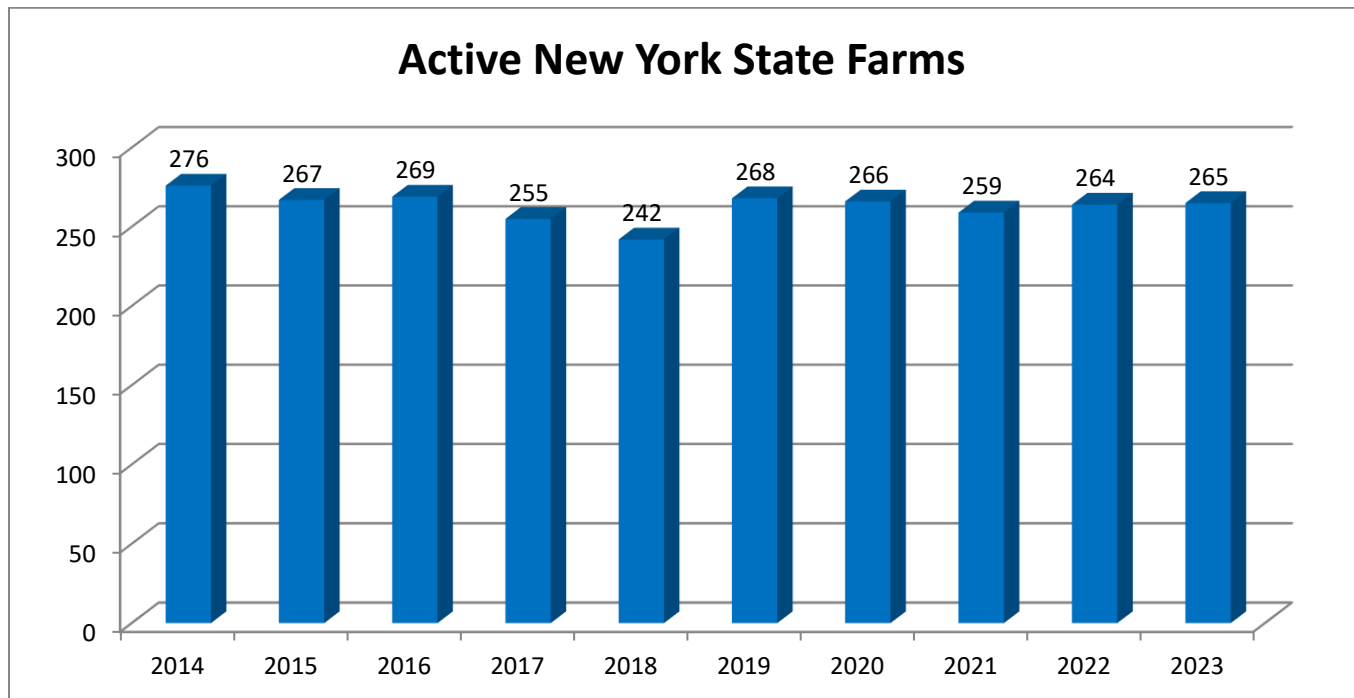

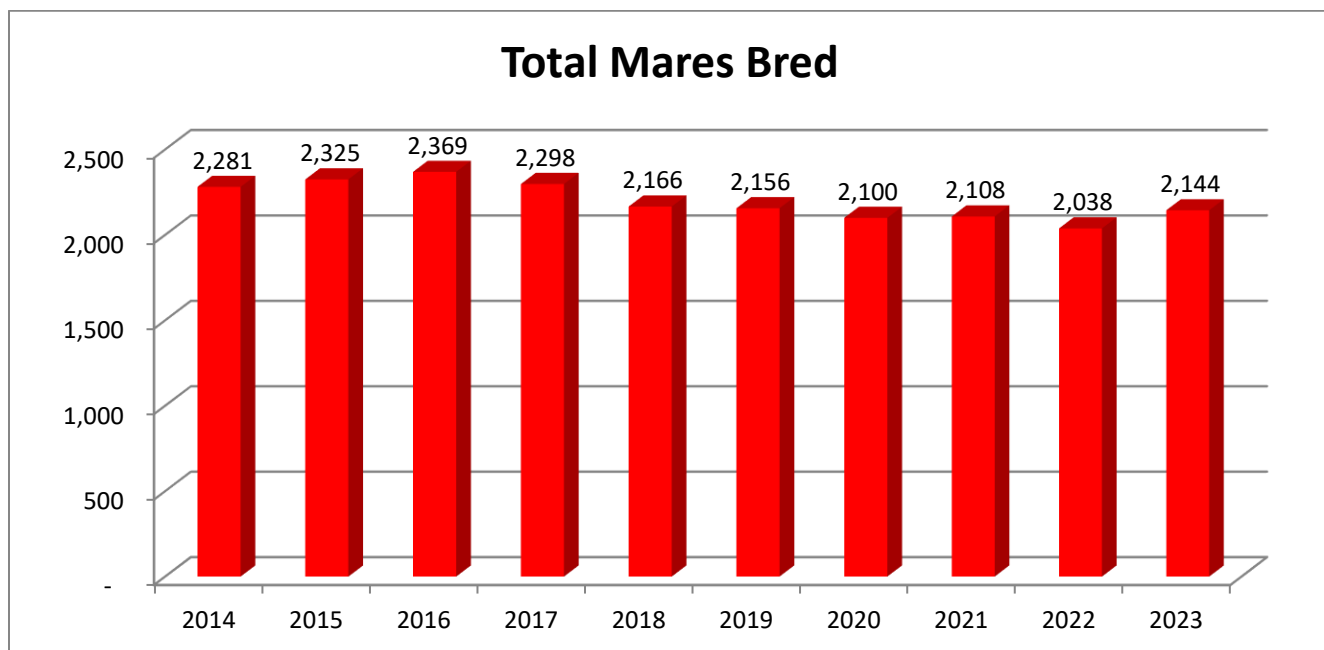

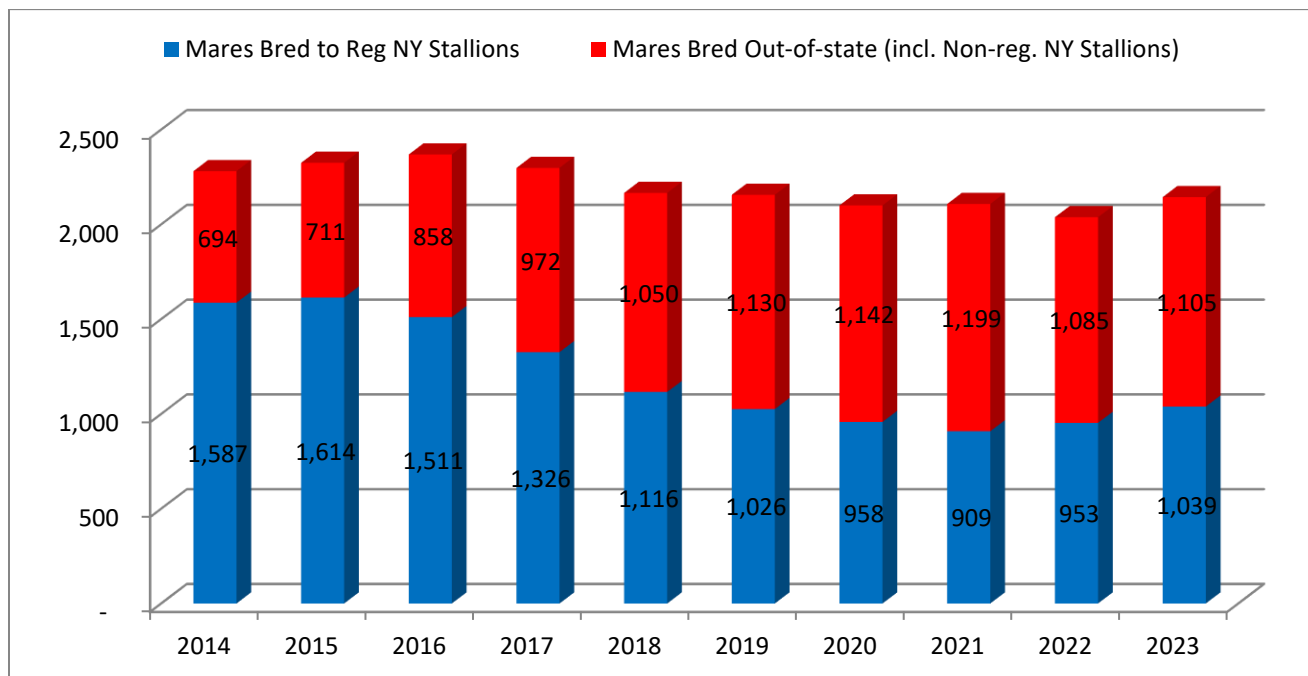
Active New York State Farms



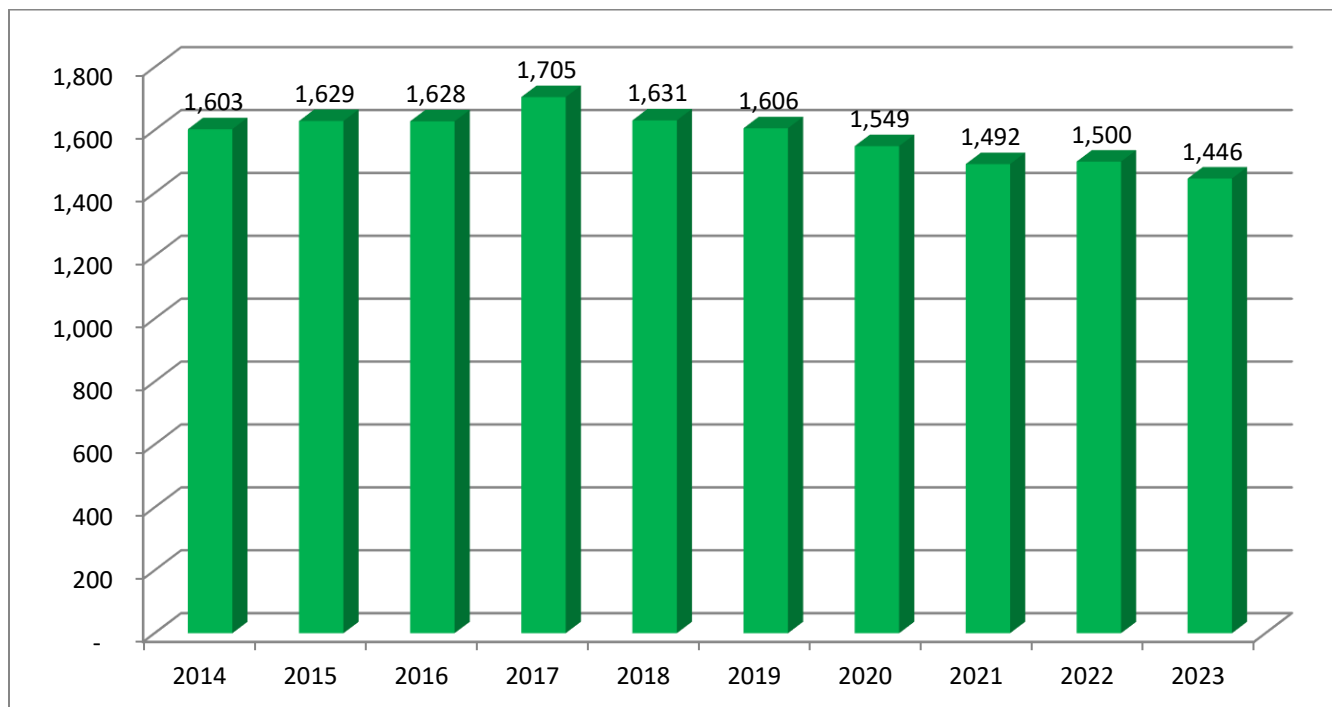
Mares Bred



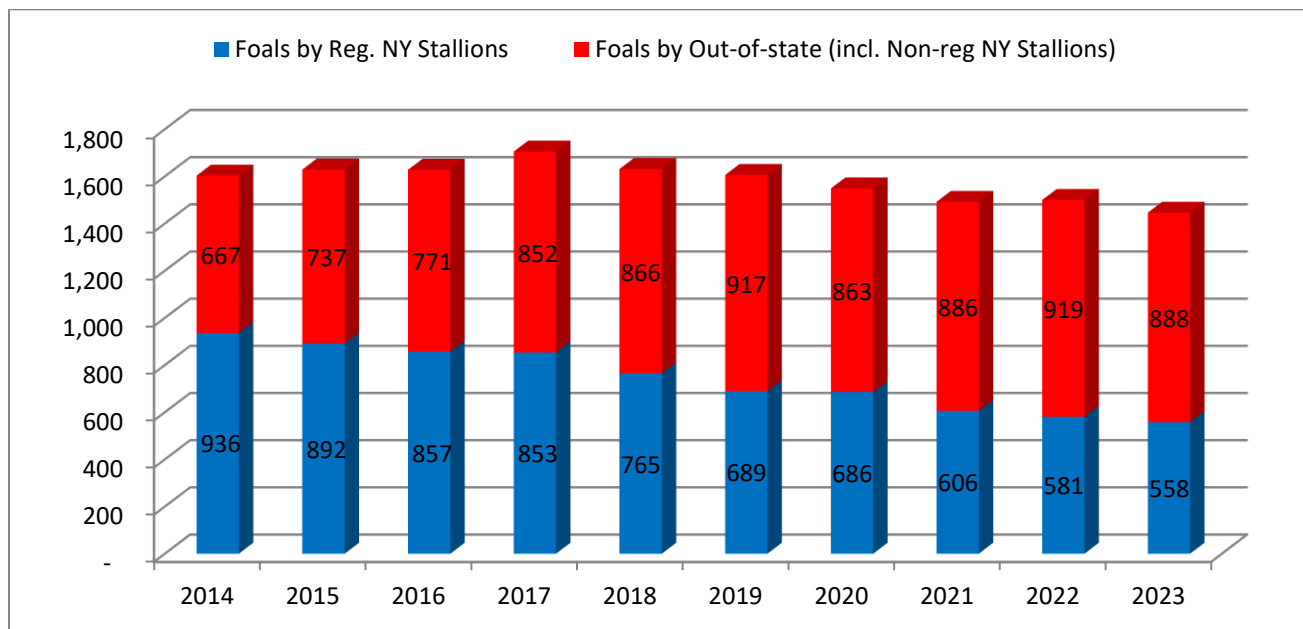
Mares Bred to Registered NY Stallions and Mares Bred Out-of-State (incl. Non-Reg. NY Stallions)



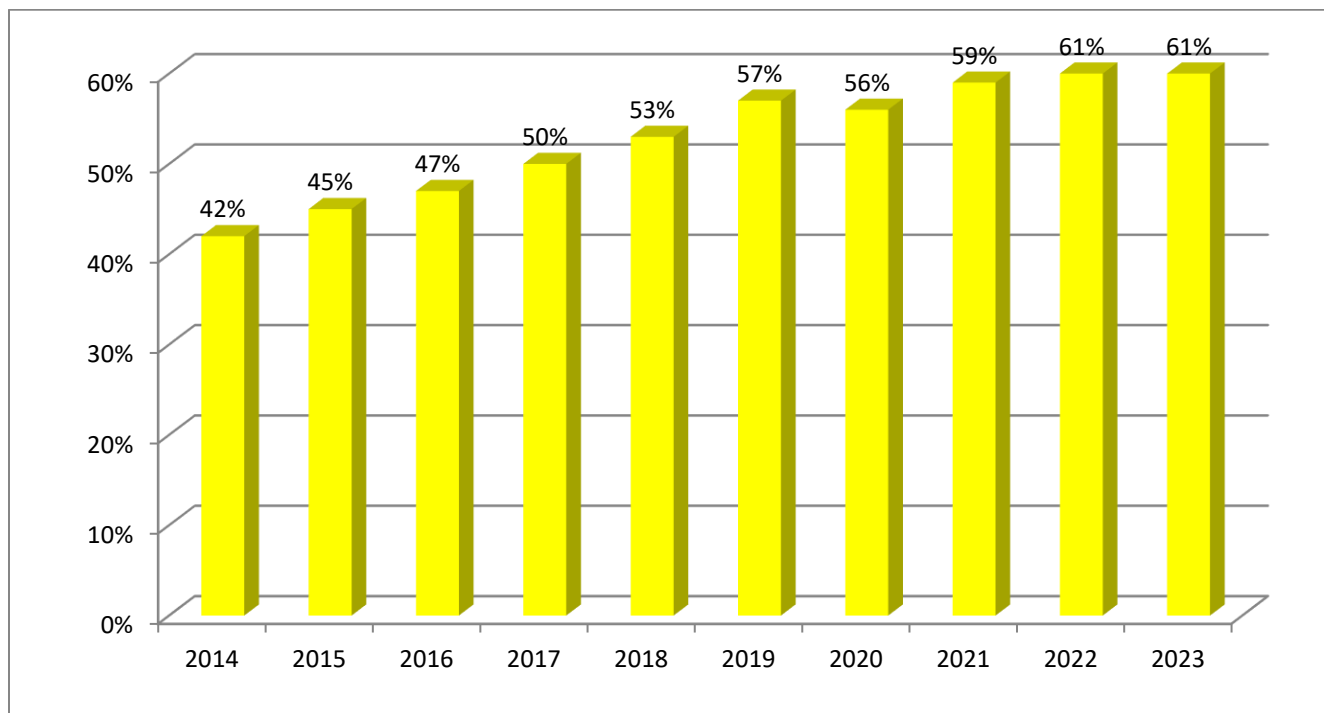
NY Foal Crop

Stallion Report

Joe and Anne McMahon have been producing talented New York-breds since they established McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in 1971. Three decades later, they could boast that their farm was where 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes winner Funny Cide had been foaled.

But the McMahons have never enjoyed a year even close to 2023, with **Central Banker** the No. 1 stallion in New York and **Solomini** the leading first-crop stallion outside Kentucky. Such was Solomini's impact that he was the sire of nine of the 25 two-year-olds in the two \$500,000 races in the New York Stallion Stakes Series on December 16th at Aqueduct, including one of the winners, My Shea D Lady. "We've liked Solomini all along and we were lucky to get him in the first place," Joe McMahon said. "He won a Grade 1 and they took him down. If they gave him that Grade 1, he'd be in Kentucky for a lot more money. We were very fortunate that way."

Solomini finished first in the Grade 1 Los Alamitos Futurity but was disqualified to third. He finished second in the G1 Frontrunner Stakes and the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and third in the G1 Los Alamitos Cash Call Futurity as a two-year-old. As a three-year-old he finished second in the G2 Rebel Stakes, third in the G1 Arkansas Derby, and third in the G3 Affirmed Stakes. The son of two-time Horse of the Year Curlin is out of the Storm Cat mare Surf Song. Solomini's career record in 16 starts was two victories, four seconds, five thirds and earnings of \$834,993.

Solomini's progeny earnings of \$1,407,998 ranked seventh nationally among first-crop sires. There was no other stallion in the top 13 first-crop sires standing outside Kentucky. Solomini also finished 27th nationally among sires of two-year-olds.

Central Banker, a son of Speightstown out of Rhum by Go for Gin, was a star on the track, winning four of 13 starts with three seconds, two thirds and earnings of \$598,786.

He finished 81st nationally in progeny earnings, with \$4,176,048.

Tourist, who stands at Rockridge Stud in Hudson, ranked 119th nationally with progeny earnings of \$2,829,088. A son of Tiznow out of Unbridled Melody by Unbridled's Song, Tourist earned \$2,170,340 on the track thanks to six victories, including the 2016 Breeders' Cup Mile, three seconds and four thirds in just 18 starts.

At the end of the year it was announced that **Bucchero** would stand at McMahon's in 2024 after standing five years in Florida. On the track, the son of Kantharos out of Meetmeontime by General Meeting won 11 of 31 starts with six seconds, three thirds and earnings of \$947,936. His progeny in 2023 earned \$2,703,877, ranking 16th nationally among second-crop stallions. He was also 45th nationally among sires of two-year-olds.

The McMahons also stood **Redesdale**, who ranked 30th nationally among second-crop sires, with progeny earnings of \$767,921.

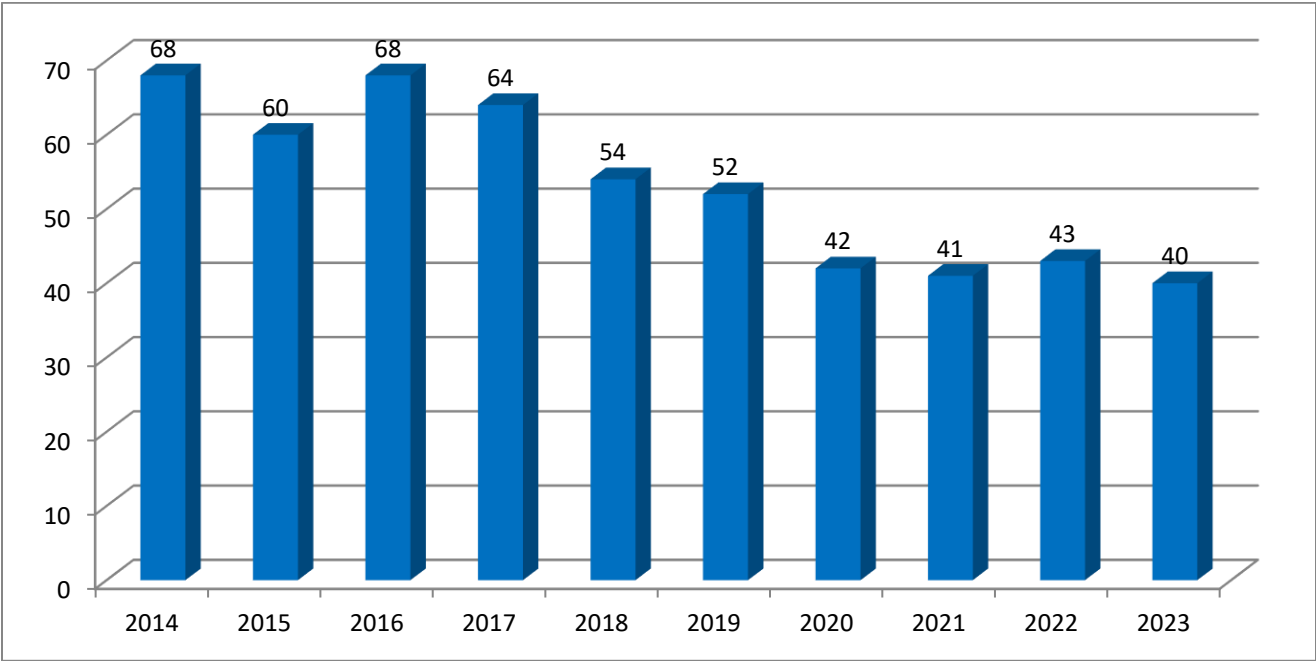
The late sire **The Lieutenant** finished 31st nationally among second-crop sires, at \$730,918.

The top ten sires in New York were Central Banker, Tourist, **War Dancer** (Irish Hill & Dutchess Views Stallions), **Freud** (Sequel Stallions), **Bustin Stones** (Waldorf Farm), **Mission Impazible** (Sequel Stallions),

Bellamy Road, Union Jackson (Sequel Stallions), **Big Brown** (Irish Hill and Dutchess Views Stallions) and **Micromanage**.

New York-Bred Auction Summary

NY-BREDS AT AUCTION: 2023*

Summary

The auction results for New York-breds in 2023 can be characterized quite simply as “correction without contraction.”

In 2023, for the third time in the VLT era (2011 forward), the New York-bred bloodstock market followed a blockbuster, record-breaking year (2022) with an organic market correction. This is the third iteration of a pattern that has emerged during a period of overall growth and expansion in the New York breeding program (2011-2023).

Against the backdrop of the two other instances of this phenomenon (2015-2016 and 2018-2019), the correction of 2023 does not raise any red flags. It is far less dramatic than the first correction, and comparable to the second (see further below). Moreover, although 2023 could not match the lofty heights of 2022, sale results across all three sectors were solid in 2023, and in some cases strong. As will be seen in the overview below and in the sector-by-sector analyses that follow, the key indicators for 2023, for the most part, rank among the top two, three or four historical highs.

Finally, it is noteworthy that the market correction of 2023 was *not* accompanied by market contraction. On the contrary, a record number of New York-breds successfully changed hands at public auction in 2023. This is part and parcel of a steady upward trend. Both 2021 and 2022 saw record numbers of New York-breds sold at North American auctions (924 and 946, respectively). In 2023 the total was 1010, topping four digits for the first time. This is the mark of a healthy bloodstock market.

2010-2023 at a Glance: Peaks and Corrections

A look at New York-bred sales data spanning the VLT era puts the nature and scale of the market correction of 2023 in its proper perspective. Again, the data for 2023 represents the third iteration of a cyclic pattern that has emerged during the period of growth and expansion of the New York-bred program since 2011.

Following the New York racing and breeding program enhancements of 2011,¹ the New York-bred bloodstock market began to expand dramatically. The upward trend continued unabated until 2016 when, after a series of

¹ For reference, the VLTs at Resorts World New York were finally approved on September 13, 2010. NYRA announced its first purse hikes in September 2011, followed by the Fund’s announcement in October of a 50% across-the-board increase in breeder awards and substantial increases in the award caps. On October 28, 2011, the casino opened its doors.

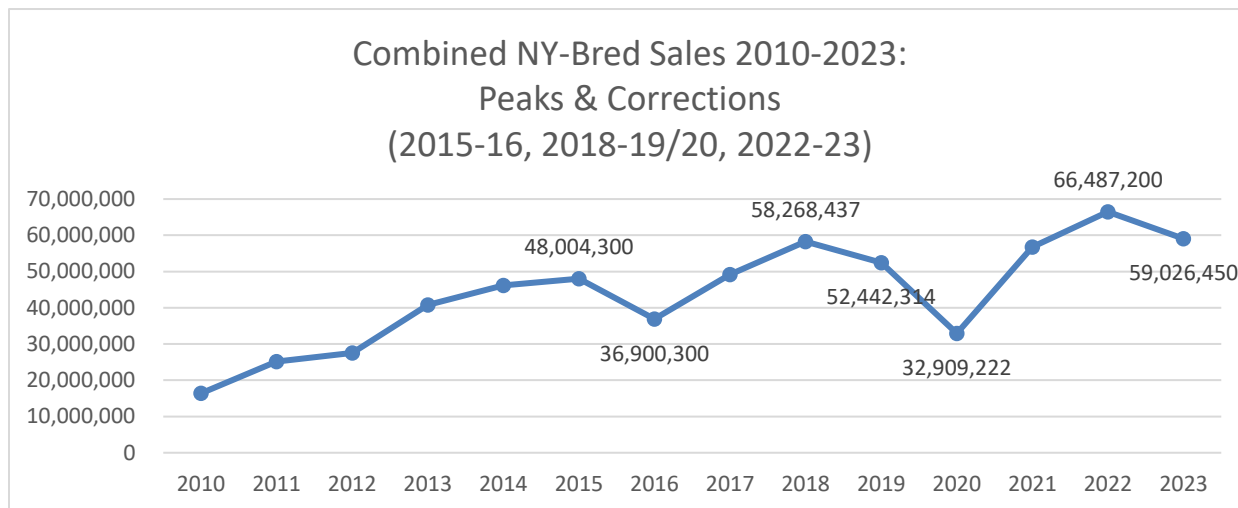
record-setting years that lasted until 2015, total sales dipped rather dramatically from \$48,004,300 to \$36,900,300 in 2016 (down 23.8%). The key indicators (total sales, average and median) for the three types of sales horses (yearlings, two-year-olds and weanlings) declined in a roughly commensurate fashion.

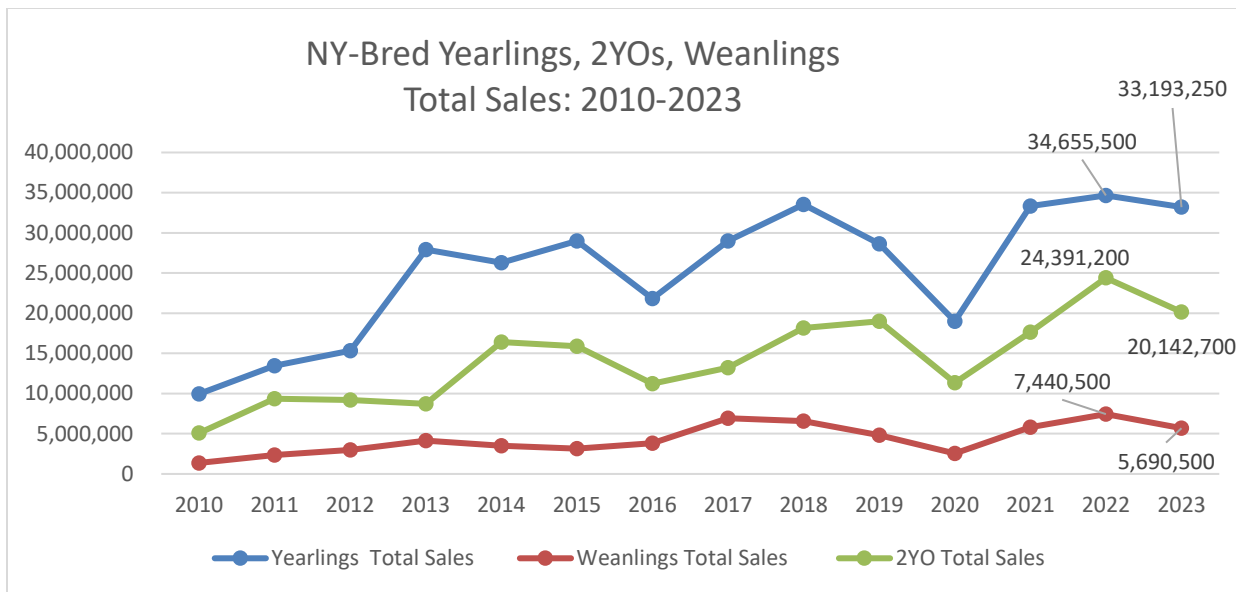
The market recovered the following year and rose until the second cyclic correction in 2019. In 2018, New York-breds posted record total sales of \$58,268,437. In 2019, the figure dipped to \$52,442,314 (down 10.0%). It could probably go without saying that in 2022, Covid became an overwhelmingly inhibitive factor in the national and New York-bred bloodstock market. As it turned out, the full decline in total sales of NY-breds over 2018-2020 (from \$58,268,437 in 2018 to \$32,909,222 in 2020) was 43.5%. The unique and anomalous data for 2020 are best set aside as outliers.

To recap, 2022 the New York-bred bloodstock market saw:

- Record total sales across all sale sectors
- A record-breaking average for two-year-olds, along with the second-highest yearling average and third-highest weanling average
- Record median prices for all three sale sectors

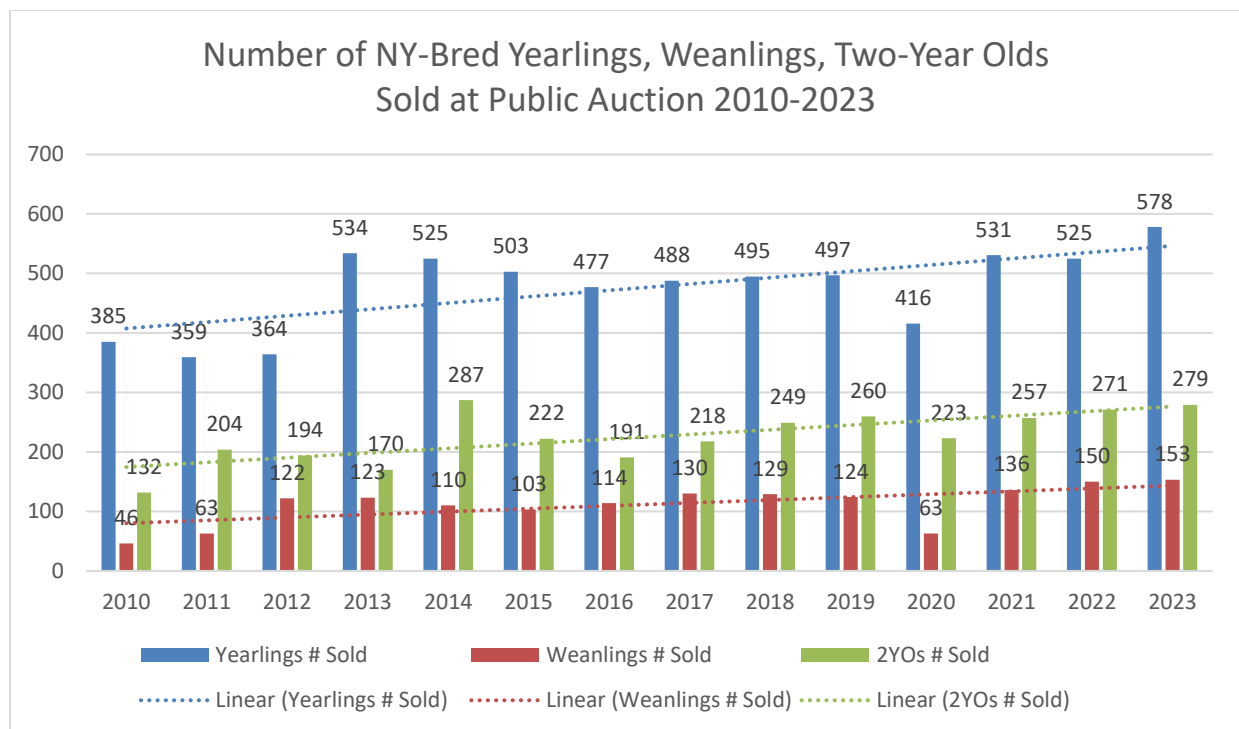
The scope and scale of the market correction in 2023 more closely resembles 2018-2019 than 2015-2016. Total New York-bred sales dipped 11.2% from \$66,487,200 in 2022 to \$59,026,450 in 2023. Moreover, this figure *still* represents the second highest total on record. This should be reassuring considering that 2023 was marked by a good deal of economic uncertainty in the U.S., dramatic increases in interest rates and fears of a possible recession.





Finally, despite giving up some ground in sales receipts, New York-breds in 2023 set a record in auction participation. The number of New York-breds that successfully changed hands at public auction hit a new all-time high of 1010. As noted in the introduction, this continues a steady upward trend of New York-breds sold at auction, following record overall participation in 2021 (924) and 2022 (946).

As to participation numbers for the individual sectors, a record number of yearlings sold in 2023 at 578; the next highest number was 534 in 2013. The year-over-year increase from 525 in 2022 was 10.1%. The number of two-year-olds sold in 2023 was 279, up 3.0% over the prior year and second only to the 287 seen in 2014. Weanlings saw an all-time high of 153 individuals sold, up 2.0% from the total of 150 in 2022, which was also a record. To reiterate, robust and successful participation in public auctions is the sign of a thriving market.



STATISTICAL REVIEW AND ANALYSIS by Sales Sector

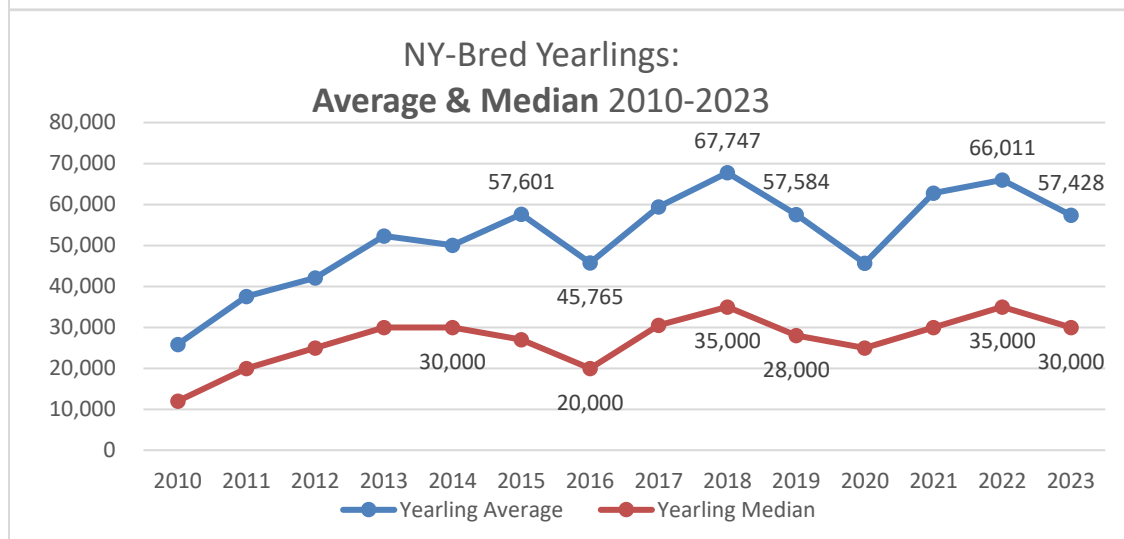
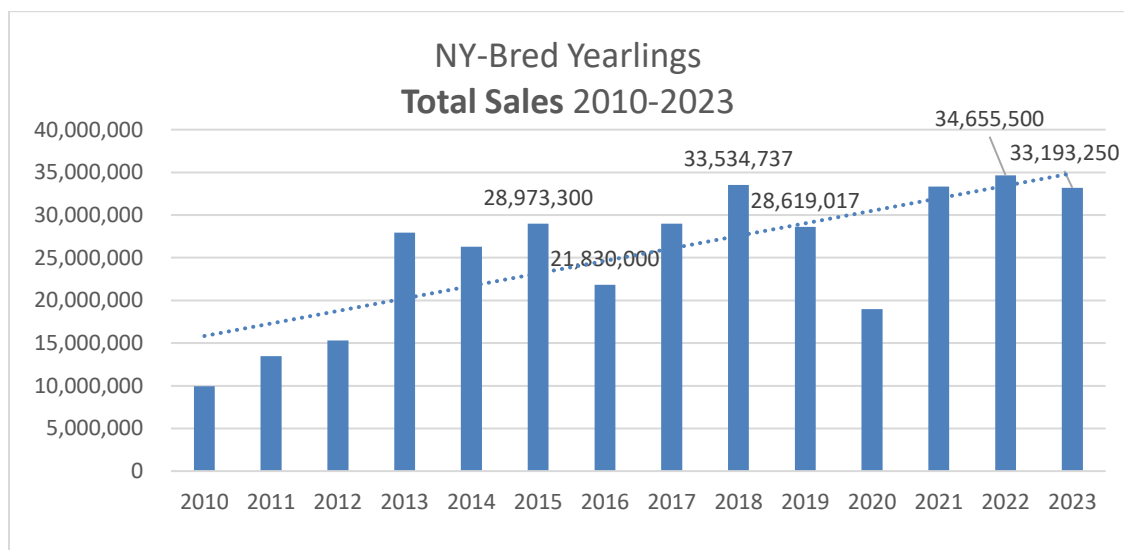
New York-Bred Yearling Sales in 2023

A record number of New York-bred yearlings (578) sold for a total of \$33,193,250 in 2023, which was down just 4.2% from last year's record of \$34,655,500. Total New York-bred yearling sales have topped \$30 million four times in all: 2018 and 2021-2023. The 2023 gross marks the fourth-highest sales figure for the group.

The 2023 average and median prices for yearlings more closely mirror the 11.2% dip in total cumulative sales for the year. The average yearling price of \$57,428 dipped 13.0% from last year's \$66,011 average. The \$30,000 median declined 14.3% from last year's co-top figure of \$35,000.

Data for the VLT era as a whole demonstrates that the peaks and corrections in key indicators for the yearling sector (total sales, average and median) mirror the behavior of the entire market, as outlined above. Again, the figures for 2020 are obvious outliers.



New York-Bred Yearling Top Achiever of 2023

Over the past decade, competition at the top end of the Thoroughbred bloodstock market has been fierce, and every year New Yorkers account for their fair share of headliners. Among the more than 100 New York-bred yearlings who sold for six figures in 2023, 34 individuals brought \$200,000 and up; 13 sold for \$300,000 and up; four went for \$400,000 and up; and three brought \$500,000 and up.

New York's top yearling of the year sold on Tuesday, August 8, 2023 during the second session of the two-day Fasig-Tipton sale of selected yearlings in Saratoga. The New York topper, a filly from the first crop of

Authentic bred by Kristen and Matt Esler's Thirty Year Farm, brought a winning bid of \$725,000 from Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation.

Foaled on April 15, 2022, the bay filly debuted in the sales ring as a weanling at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Mixed sale, where she failed to attain her reserve on a final bid of \$390,000.

The filly's dam Achalaya is an unraced daughter of Bellamy Road who was purchased by Thirty Year Farm with the sale filly in utero for \$725,000 at the 2021 Keeneland November Breeding sale. All four of Achalaya's foals to start are winners, led by the hardy Casa Creed, who has earned more than \$2.6 million over six seasons in 34 career starts. Among Casa Creed's achievements are four Grade 1 wins (Fourstardave H. and Jaipur S., twice each), as well as victories in the Grade 2 Hall of Fame S., Grade 3 Kelso S. and two more listed stakes. Achalaya is also the dam of graded winner Chess's Dream. The mare foaled a Curlin filly on April 20, 2023 and is presumed in foal to Life Is Good.

New York-Bred 2-Year-Old Sales in 2023

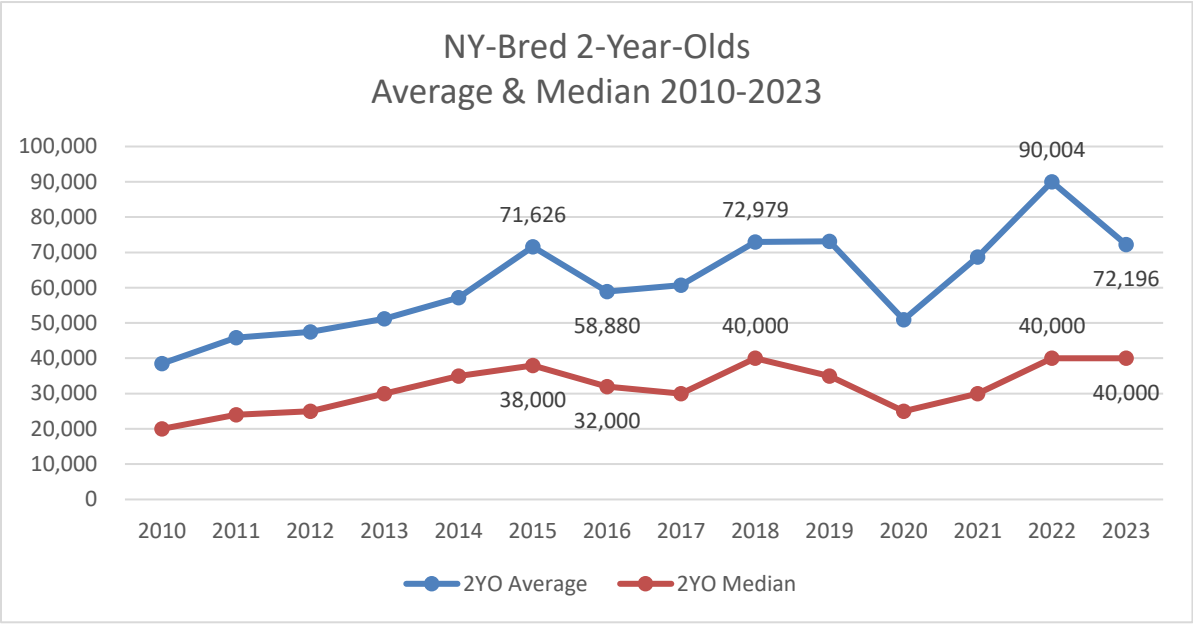
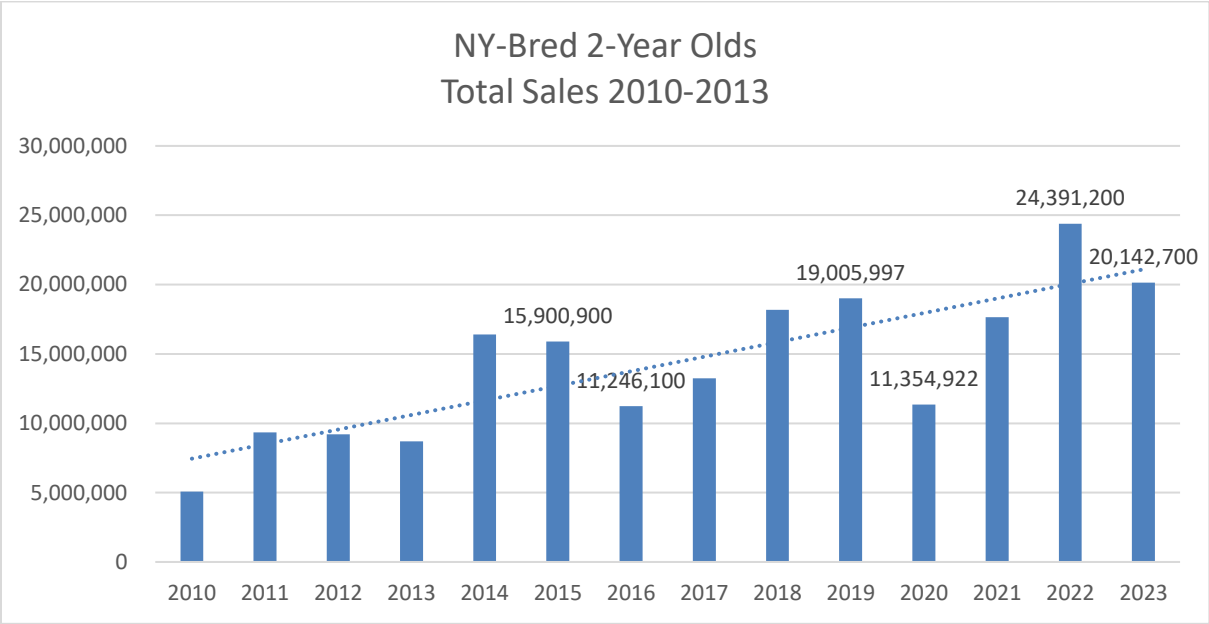
In 2022, the 2-year-old sector saw the most growth among the New Yorkers at auction, as total sales increased by well over a third (38.1%). The group posted a record-high average price of \$90,000 (up 31.0%) and co-top median price of \$40,000. In 2023, the key indicators returned to earth but did not by any means give up all the dramatic gains of the prior year.

Total juvenile sales for 2023 were \$20,142,700, which was down 17.4% from 2022 but was still the second-highest figure historically. The average price landed at \$72,196, down 19.8% from last year's eye-popping \$90,004 but still ranking as the fourth-highest figure overall. The 2-year-old median price held its ground at \$40,000 to retain its co-top ranking (with 2018 and 2022).

Finally, in keeping with the high level of New York-bred participation in public auctions across the board in 2023, 279 juveniles successfully changed hands, up from 271 last year and second only to 2018, when the market saw 287 individuals sell.

New York-Bred 2-Year-Old Top Achiever of 2023

OBS March 2-Year-Old Sale ([Hip 489](#))

Georgie's Angel 2021, colt by Arrogate, bred by Kathleen Schweizer
(\$1,050,000)

The New York-bred 2-year-old sales season got off to a lightning-fast start when Shingo Hashimoto, agent for Katsumi Yoshida, went to \$1,050,000 to purchase Hip 489, a dark bay or brown New York-bred colt by the late champion Arrogate at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March Sale. The colt, a full brother to dual Grade 1 winner and Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Cave Rock, was bred by Kathleen Schweizer and foaled on April 17, 2021 at Longford Farm in Elmira. He was the third top-seller of the entire auction.

The pedigree page of the seven-figure Arrogate colt really pops. His dam, Georgie's Angel, has produced three other winners besides 2022 juvenile standout Cave Rock. A Kentucky-bred daughter of Bellamy Road, Georgie's Angel is a graded stakes winner in her own right and was a precocious runner, winning the 2011 Grade 3 Schuylerville Stakes at Saratoga as a juvenile. Georgie's Angel's is also a half-sister to graded winner Lawn Ranger. The sale colt's third dam is a multiple stakes winner in Canada and multiple stakes producer. Georgie's Angel was purchased by Longford Farm with the sale colt in utero for \$75,000 at the 2020 Keeneland November Sale.

The Arrogate colt previously set a new record price at the Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale in 2022, when he was purchased by Tom McCrocklin on behalf of Champion Equine for \$700,000. At OBS, the colt turned in an outstanding :21 1/5 quarter-mile breeze for the same consignor. He was relocated to Japan.

New York-Bred Weanling Sales in 2023

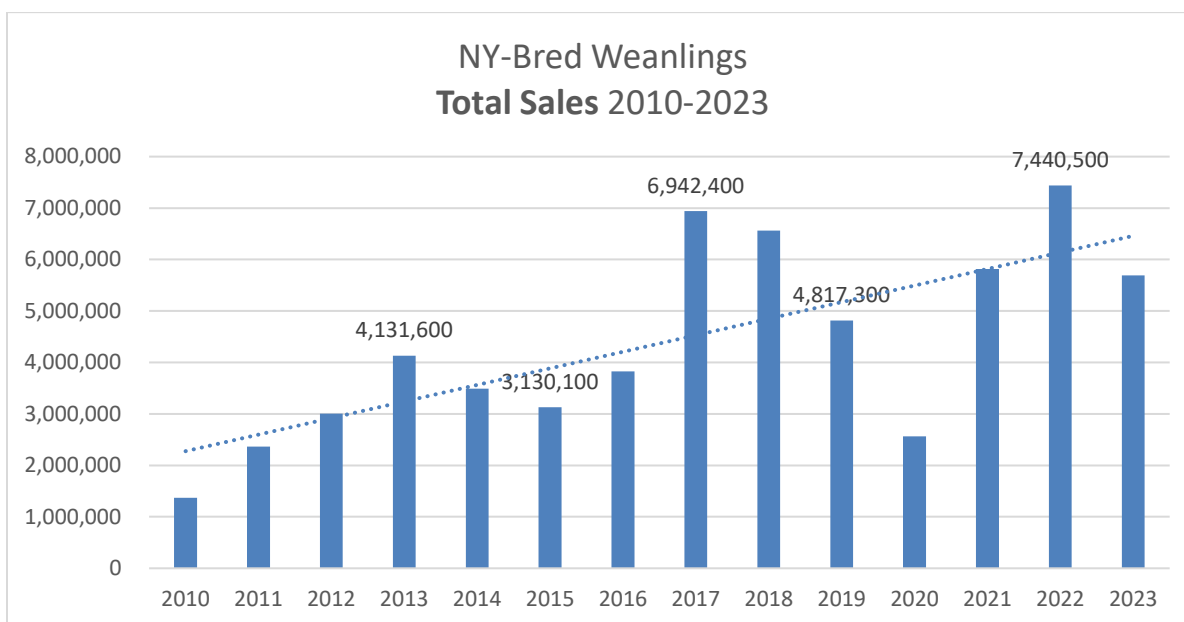
New York-bred weanlings, the most variable sales sector of the three, gave up most of the gains of 2022, but not all of them. 2022 saw a new record for total New York-bred weanling sales of \$7,440,500 (up 27.9% from the prior year). 2023 weanling sales dipped by 23.5% to \$5,690,500. The sector also gave back 25% of last year's average price, dipping from \$49,603 to \$37,193, but fared a little better with the median, which declined 21.5% from \$32,500 to \$25,500. As with the yearlings and 2-year-olds, a record number of weanlings sold in 2023 (153).

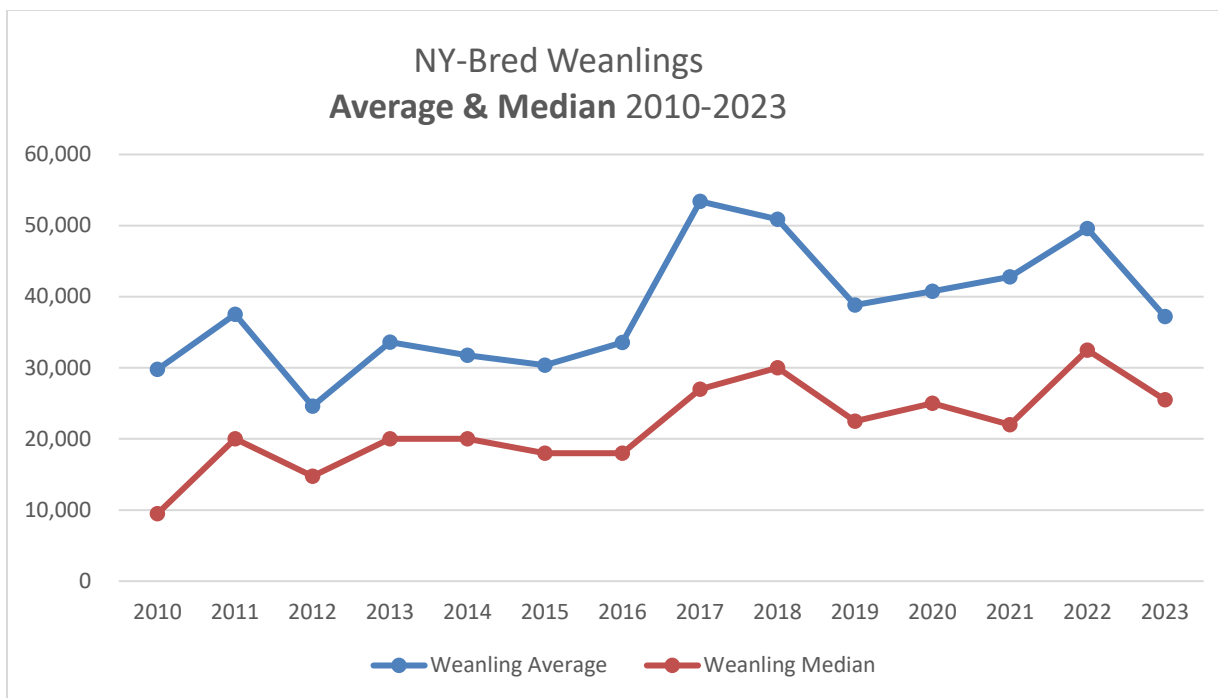

As is the case with yearlings and 2-year-olds, a wider window of data reveals that the New York-bred weanling sector has experienced three peaks (2013, 2017, 2022) and corrections (2014-15, 2018-19, 2023). Because each of the two prior weanling corrections has lasted two years, it will be interesting to see what recovery, if any, 2024 brings to the weanling market.





New York-Bred Weanling Top Achiever of 2023
 Fasig-Tipton New York Fall Mixed Sale ([Hip 251](#))
 Popstar 2023, colt by Good Magic, bred by Fortune Farm
 (\$230,000)

Richard Nicolai's Fortune Farm bred the top-selling New York-bred weanling of 2023, a bay colt by Good Magic out of Popstar who was foaled on February 11, 2023 at Mill Creek Farm in Stillwater. Purchased by C F Farm for \$230,000, the colt established a new weanling record price at the Fasig-Tipton New York Fall Mixed Sale. Vinery Sales, Agent IV, consigned the colt.

The weanling's dam Popstar is a winner by Medaglia d'Oro who has produced five offspring and three foals to start, all of them winners, including stakes performer Lady d'Oro. Fortune Farms purchased the mare at the Keeneland January sale for \$29,000. The colt's second dam Catstar, by Storm Cat, is a group performer in England and his third dam is Advancing Star, a multiple graded winner and producer of stakes performers.

CONCLUSION

On the heels of a blockbuster, record-breaking year in 2022, New York-breds gave up ground in 2023, but overall the sales results remained solid. This marks the third time in the VLT era when a wave of new records has been followed by a market correction. The correction of 2023 was by no means as dramatic as the first occurrence of this phenomenon (2016), and was comparable to the second correction (2019). The data during the Covid year (2020) are best treated as outliers.

Even in the face of an organic market correction, the participation of New York-bred yearlings, 2-year-olds and weanlings at public auction not only remained robust in 2023 but hit a new high, with 1010 individuals changing hands successfully at public auction, the first time this total has reached four figures.

New York-Breds at the Races

New York-Breds Reach New Heights in 2023

The impact of New York-breds on New York racing was profound in 2023, and the New York Racing Association is making sure the future is even brighter for state-breds.

“The New York-bred program is critically important to the future of Thoroughbred racing in New York State,” David O’Rourke, NYRA’s President and CEO, said.

That was reflected by 514 New York-bred races being run in 2023 at its three tracks, Saratoga Race Course, Belmont Park and Aqueduct, with purses totaling over \$38 million. NYRA also continued its tradition of carding three New York-bred Showcase Days featuring only NY-bred horses, including the one at Saratoga on the day after the historic Travers Stakes, Saratoga’s most important weekend, when 113 New York-breds competed in 11 races, including six stakes, worth an aggregate \$1.25 million.

Just a couple of months later, NYRA announced what it termed “a significant investment in the future of the New York-bred program” paving the way for the 2024 New York-bred two-year-old foal crop to race for purses matching those of open-company races. In 2023, two-year-old New York-bred maidens at Saratoga raced for purses of \$88,000 compared to \$105,000 for open-company maiden races. “The new purse structure increases the value of the upcoming foal crop of New York-breds, and reflects NYRA’s commitment to the owners, breeders and trainers who choose to breed and race in New York,” O’Rourke said.

Executive Director Najja Thompson of New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. called the NYRA initiative “a strong signal to the bloodstock market on why you should breed and foal in New York and own a New York-bred to race.”

That’s been true for decades, as more and more breeders flock to New York to take advantage of the considerable owner and breeder awards available for New York-breds.

And those awards just became richer. On December 12th, the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Developmental Fund Corporation approved an increase in breeder awards to begin on January 1, 2024. The award for first-place finishes for NY-sired NY-breds was increased from 30 percent to 40 percent of purse money earned, while that for second-place finishes was upped from 15 percent to 20 percent. The award for third-place finishes for NY-sired NY-breds was reduced from 15 percent to 10 percent. The awards for non-New York-sired New York-breds were increased as well. The first-place breeder award for non-NY-sired NY-breds was upped from 15 percent to 20 percent of purse money earned, and the second-place award was increased from 7.5 percent to 10 percent. The breeder award for third-place finishes for non-NY-sired NY-breds was decreased from 7.5 percent to five percent of purse money earned.

“These bigger bonuses reward breeders for creating quality racehorses,” Tracy Egan, Executive Director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, said.

Thompson echoed her enthusiasm: “This historic increase in breeder awards is monumental news for all breeders currently participating in the New York-bred program. It’s another reason why New York remains the top state-bred program in the nation and why more breeders should bring their mares to foal in New York.”

Kip O’Neill, manager of Windylea Farm, which was the leading owner at the 2023 Aqueduct winter meet with 12 winners from 31 starters, said, “The New York-bred program is the most user-friendly one, from a breeder and owner standpoint, that I have found in the industry. As a breeder, you earn money if the horse finishes 1-2-3, whether in a stakes or a \$5,000 maiden race at Finger Lakes. As an owner, when you make the investment, you always look for the horse that can compete in open company, and when they do that, you’re paid royally for it.”

Founded 40 years ago by Kip’s late father Phil, Windylea Farm operates in Hoosick Falls, some 40 miles southwest of Saratoga Springs. It was originally located in Burlington County, Vermont, where their horses would race at the now-defunct Green Mountain Race Track.

More than 40 years ago, and 10 years after the creation of the New York-bred program, the giant grey Finger Lakes shipper Fio Rito stunned the racing world by winning the 1981 Whitney Handicap at Saratoga.

Twenty years back, in 2003, New York-bred Funny Cide won both the Grade 1 Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes. After the finish line in the Derby, Funny Cide’s Hall of Fame jockey Jose Santos told America to “Get with the program.” Funny Cide would add yet another Grade-1 jewel to his resume when he won the Jockey Club Gold Cup the following year. He remains New York-bred’s second leading earner (\$3,529,412).

In 2023, the top two New York-bred earners, nine-year-old **Red Knight** and eight-year-old **Therapist**, each won a Grade 1 stakes and became the 62nd and 63rd New York-bred millionaires. At the other end of the age spectrum, **Wynstock**, a \$700,000 purchase earlier in 2023 as a two-year-old in training, captured the Grade 2 Los Alamitos Futurity at Los Alamitos Race Course. Two other New York-bred two-year-olds, **The Wine Steward** and **Brocknardini**, also won open stakes, combining to earn more than a half-million dollars.

When Red Knight captured the Grade 1 Man o’ War Stakes at Belmont Park on May 13th by a length and a quarter, announcer John Imbriale called, “It is the New York-bred Red Knight winning the Grade 1 Man o’ War.” He is a son of Pure Prize, out of Isabel Away by Skip Away.

Red Knight’s breeder and owner Tom Egan, who races as Trinity Farm, said, “I was a devotee to Kentucky horses, but with those awards, I told my wife, ‘We’re going to breed some horses in New York.’”

He’s never regretted that decision. “I’m absolutely a fan of the New York-bred program,” he said. “How can you not be? You don’t have to race just in New York. You can go anywhere in the world if the horse will take you there.”

Indeed. All-time leading New York-bred Mind Your Biscuits, who earned \$4,279,566, ventured to Dubai to win the \$2 million Golden Shaheen in back-to-back years. And New York-bred A Shin Forward, a Grade 1 winner in Japan, accrued \$3,416,216, third highest among state-breds.

New York-bred highlights came off the track as well in 2023, with Solomini emerging as a prominent stallion for Joe and Anne McMahon's McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. The McMahons also stood New York's leading sire, Central Banker.

The first national splash by a New York-bred on the track came at Gulfstream Park when Tom Egan's great gelding Red Knight captured the Grade 3 William L. McKnight Stakes on January 28th. That kick-started his amazing nine-year-old campaign for trainer Mike Maker. Bill Mott was Red Knight's original trainer.

Exactly three weeks later at Gulfstream Park, Lawana and Robert Low's four-year-old filly **Classy Edition**, a daughter of Classic Empire out of Newbie by Bernardini bred by perennial New York-bred leaders Chester and Mary Boman, won the Grade 3 Royal Delta Stakes for trainer Todd Pletcher. The Lows purchased Classy Edition for \$550,000 as a yearling, and she has already topped her sales price with \$590,290 in earnings. She added a victory in the \$200,000 Critical Eye Stakes on New York-bred Showcase Day at Belmont Park on May 29th, and finished second by a head in the Grade 2 Delaware Handicap on July 8th.

On May 13th at Belmont Park, Red Knight, who had finished second in the Grade 2 Elkhorn Stakes at Keeneland, won his first Grade 1 stakes, capturing the Man o' War with his trademark powerful late kick. He would then finish fourth in the Grade 1 Manhattan Stakes, third in the Grade 1 United Nations, fourth in the Grade 2 Kentucky Downs Turf Cup and sixth in his final start, the Grade 3 Sycamore Stakes, just ahead of seventh-place finisher and fellow NY-bred Therapist. Red Knight had also beaten Therapist when he finished fourth in the Kentucky Downs Turf Cup, with Therapist running eighth. Red Knight retired with 12 victories, nine seconds and two thirds in 38 starts, for earnings of \$1,866,330. Red Knight was sent to Michael Blowen's Old Friends Farm in Georgetown, Kentucky, where he will be admired by fans and spoiled for the rest of his life.

Six days after Red Knight's Grade 1 score in the Man o' War, former New York Giants Hall of Fame Coach Bill Parcells, who races as August Dawn Farm, watched his unbeaten three-year-old **Maple Leaf Mel** take the Grade 3 Miss Preakness Stakes at Pimlico Race Course. Then trained by Jeremiah Englehart, Maple Leaf Mel would be transferred to Englehart's assistant, rookie trainer Melanie Giddings. Maple Leaf Mel had been named after Giddings, who overcame the Stage 4 ovarian and endocervical cancer that she was diagnosed with in 2020. Giddings did a fantastic job with the ill-fated daughter of Cross Traffic out of City Gift by City Place, who was bred by Joe Fafone and was purchased for \$150,000 as an unraced two-year-old. She ended her two-year-old season two-for-two by taking the Seeking the Ante Stakes for New York-breds. She began her three-year-old season with another New York-bred stakes score in the East View, before venturing to Maryland.

In her first start for Giddings, Maple Leaf Mel won the Grade 3 Victory Ride Stakes at Belmont Park on July 6th. That made her five-for-five, and Giddings pointed her to the \$500,000 Grade 1 Test Stakes on August 5th at Saratoga.

Racing on the lead from the onset, Maple Leaf Mel was cruising on a three-length lead some 10 feet from the finish line when she went down with a catastrophic injury to her right front leg. She had to be euthanized. Parcells comforted Giddings as they walked out of the track in shock.

In a loving, comforting gesture, trainer Brendan Walsh, whose Pretty Mischievous won the Test, delivered the winning wreath to Maple Leaf Mel's empty stall, saying, "She was the best horse in the race. We got beat fair and square."

On January 20th at Gulfstream Park, Michael Dubb claimed the eight-year-old gelding Therapist out of a \$50,000 claiming race in which he finished third. The son of Freud out of the Smart Strike mare Lady Renaissance paid immediate dividends, taking an allowance race and the Grade 2 Pan American Stakes by three-quarters of a length. After finishing eighth in the Grade 3 Louisville Stakes at Churchill Downs and second by a head in the \$160,000 Chorleywood Overnight Stakes at Ellis Park, Therapist journeyed to New Jersey to contest the Grade 1 United Nations Stakes at Monmouth Park on July 22nd. He won by a length and a quarter. "He's a pleasure," Dubb said. "I competed against him for many years. He's just a hard-hitting older New York-bred horse. I'm just fortunate to own him."

Therapist closed out his season with a seventh-place finish in the Grade 3 Sycamore at Keeneland and a nose win in an allowance race on the synthetic course at Gulfstream Park. That made him 14-for-45 with five seconds, eight thirds and earnings of \$1,389,740.

Pantofel Stable, Wachtel Stable and Gary Barber's **Bold Journey**, a four-year-old colt bred by Fred W. Hentrich III and John D. Fielding, capped an outstanding season by winning three straight starts. After taking an open allowance race by a nose, he added the Grade 3 Fall Highweight Stakes by one length for trainer Bill Mott on November 24th, and the \$150,000 Gravesend Stakes on December 30th. Earlier in the year, the son of Hard Spun out of Polly Freeze by Super Saver had finished fifth in the Grade 1 Carter Handicap. For the year, he had five wins and three seconds from nine starts. Lifetime, he has seven wins and six seconds from 20 starts, for earnings of \$568,743.

On December 16th at Los Alamitos Race Course, Dr. Edward Allred, who normally races quarter horses, and Los Alamitos Vice President Jack Liebau's two-year-old New York-bred Wynstock delivered trainer Bob Baffert's 14th victory in the Grade 2 Los Alamitos Futurity. Empire Equines bred the son of Solomini, who is out of Timberlea by Flatter.

Sent off at 13-1 odds in a field of just five, Wynstock led virtually all the way, got passed late, came on again to win, and then survived an inquiry. Originally purchased for \$50,000 at the 2022 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, Allred and Liebau got him for \$700,000 as a two-year-old at the Ocala Breeders Sale in April. Racing exclusively in California, he finished fourth, fifth and then first by 7 ½ lengths in three maiden special weights before stepping up to Grade 2 stakes company. He now is two-for-four with earnings of \$162,740.

Two other two-year-old New York-breds showed great ability, the first on dirt and the second on turf. Paradise Farm Corp. and David Staudacher's colt The Wine Steward won his maiden debut emphatically by six lengths on May 28th at Belmont Park. Bred by Sequel Thoroughbreds, Lakland Farm and Mark Toothaker, the son of Vino Rosso out of Call to Service by To Honor and Serve is trained by Mike Maker.

On July 2nd, The Wine Steward took his game to another level, humbling his competition by 3 ¾ lengths in the \$200,000 Bashford Manor Stakes at Ellis Park. Back in New York, The Wine Steward upped his record to three-for-three by taking the \$200,000 Funny Cide Stakes on Showcase Day at Saratoga by a head on August 27th.

Shipped to Keeneland, The Wine Steward was an ultra-game second by a half-length in the Grade 1 Breeders Futurity on October 7th.

He had done enough to enter the Grade 1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita. He drew the rail and his morning-line odds were 8-1. He would have been the only New York-bred starter in the Breeders' Cup, but he had to be scratched. His final numbers for his first season were three victories and one second in a Grade 1 stakes in four starts, for earnings of \$370,260.

Thomas and Daryn A. Brockley's filly Brocknardini, bred by Thirty Year Farm, won her Saratoga debut by 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths for trainer George Weaver at Saratoga on August 24th. The daughter of Palace Malice out of the Bernardini mare Broad Stripes next started in the Grade 1 Natalma Stakes at Woodbine, finishing far back. She redeemed herself in the \$150,000 Selima Stakes at Laurel Park on September 30th, winning by 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ lengths. She was an also-eligible in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filly Turf, but didn't draw in, leaving her two-for-three in 2023 with earnings of \$138,770.

Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and Peter and Patty Searles six-year-old **City Man**, a son of Mucho Macho Man out of City Scamper by City Zip bred by Moonstar Farm, is no stranger to graded-stakes company. He won the Grade 3 Forbidden Apple Stakes by 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths at Saratoga on July 15th, 2022, and ended the year by taking the Grade 2 Fort Lauderdale Stakes at Gulfstream Park on New Year's Eve by a length and a quarter for trainer Christophe Clement.

Twenty-nine days later, he finished 12th by five lengths as the 7-2 favorite in the Grade 1 Pegasus World Cup Turf. He bounced right back, however, to finish third in the Grade 2 Fort Marcy at Belmont Park on May 6th.

Showcase Days

City Man then became the only horse to win two Showcase Day stakes in 2023. On May 29th at Belmont Park, he won the Kingston Stakes by a nose. In his next start at Saratoga on August 23rd, he won his second consecutive West Point Stakes by a length and a quarter. He finished his season with a third and a second in a pair of New York-bred stakes, the Ashley T. Cole and the Mohawk, respectively. That gave him two victories, one second and a pair of thirds from six starts in 2023, for earnings of \$257,750. His career numbers are 11 victories, six seconds and five thirds from 32 starts, good for \$1,244,870.

The other stakes winners on the first Showcase Day at Belmont Park on May 29th were **Bankit**, Classy Edition, **Downtown Mischief**, **Maker's Candy** and **Marvelous Maude**.

Bankit, a seven-year-old horse owned by Winchell Thoroughbreds and Willis Horton Racing, added to his incredible resume a game victory by a head in the \$200,000 Commentator Stakes. The son of Central Banker out of Sister in Arms by Colonel John was bred by Hidden Book Farm and Blue Devil Racing. Trained by Steve Asmussen, Bankit had one victory, one second and two thirds from five starts in 2023. His career record is nine-for-41 with 12 seconds, seven thirds and earnings of \$1,421,405. One of his stakes victories was in open company in the 2021 \$100,000 John B. Campbell Stakes at Laurel Park. Before that he finished second by a head in the 2020 Grade 3 Razorback Handicap at Oaklawn Park.

Downtown Mischief, owned and bred by Lady Sheila Stable and trained by Linda Rice, captured the Bouwerie Stakes. The Into Mischief filly out of Downtown Mama by Speightstown is four-for-seven lifetime, with earnings of \$234,370.

Paradise Farms Corp., David Staudacher and Maxis Stable's three-year-old colt Maker's Candy, bred by Newtownanner Stud, won the Mike Lee Stakes for trainer Mike Maker. The son of Twirling Candy out of Purple Cat by Bluegrass Cat is four-for-10 lifetime with two seconds and \$290,350 in earnings.

Mount Vernon Stakes winner Marvelous Maude is owned by Michael Dubb, The Elkstone Group (Stuart Grant) and Michael J. Caruso. Beechwood Bruckner LLC bred the five-year-old daughter of NY stallion Slumber (GB) out of Wait Your Turn by Warrior's Reward, who is trained by Chad Brown. She has five victories, three seconds and a pair of thirds from 12 career starts, for earnings of \$374,500.

Saratoga's Showcase Day on August 27th was quite an afternoon for Robert Evans, who won two of the six stakes with homebreds **Drake's Passage** and **New Ginya**. Joining them, City Man and The Wine Steward as Showcase Day winners were **Caldwell Luvs Gold** and **Ichiban**.

Evans' three-year-old colt Drake's Passage, a son of Tonalist out of Raucous by Speightstown, dominated in the \$250,000 Albany Stakes, taking his third straight race by 7 ³/₄ lengths for trainer Christophe Clement. Drake's Passage then finished third in an open allowance, fifth against older horses in the Empire Classic and second in an allowance race. His three wins, one second and two thirds helped him to career earnings of \$271,480.

Evans' four-year-old filly New Ginya, a daughter of Tonalist out of Rapid Rhythm by Successful Appeal, is also trained by Clement. She won the Yaddo Stakes, then finished fourth in the John Hettinger Stakes in her final start of 2023. She is four-for-13 with four seconds, two thirds and earnings of \$341,610.

Dicke Racing's two-year-old filly Caldwell Luvs Gold, bred by Jeremiah Desmond and Drumkenny Farm, upped her record to two-for-two by taking the Seeking the Ante Stakes by a half-length. The daughter of Goldencents out of Snow by Quality Road then finished second in the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes, third as the 2-5 favorite in the Maid of the Mist Stakes on Showcase Day at Aqueduct, and fifth in the Grade 2 Demoiselle. Trained by Brad Cox, she is two-for-five with one second and one third, for earnings of \$217,400.

Ichiban, a three-year-old Street Sense filly out of Cover Girl by Out of Place, is owned by Cypress Creek Equine. She was bred by Southern Equine Stables and has prospered for trainer Linda Rice. She won the Fleet Indian Stakes at Saratoga on Showcase Day and has three victories and two seconds in 11 career starts, for earnings of \$286,1900.

William J. Butler's two homebred winners out of the same mare highlighted the final Showcase Day of 2023 at Aqueduct on October 29th. The other winners were **Amanda's Folly**, **El Grande O**, **Know It All Audrey**, **Spirit of St. Louis**, **Sterling Silver** and **Straight Arrow**.

William J. Butler's homebred two-year-old filly **My Mane Squeeze**, a daughter of Audible out of In Spite of Mama by Speightstown, took the Maid of the Mist Stakes. That gave her two victories and two thirds in four starts, with \$183,960 in earnings.

Butler's second winner of the day was his four-year-old colt **Rotknee**, who captured the Hudson Stakes. The son of Runhappy out of In Spite of Mama has won eight of his 16 lifetime starts with three seconds, one third and earnings of \$527,955.

Linda Rice owns and trains Amanda's Folly, a three-year-old daughter of Mendelsohn out of Privacy by Notebook who was bred by Lambholm and won the Ticonderoga Stakes in her final start of the year. She has won five of her 18 career starts with four seconds, one third and \$349,310 in earnings.

Barry Schwartz's homebred two-year-old colt El Grande O, also trained by Linda Rice, won his second New York-bred stakes by taking the Sleepy Hollow Stakes. Previously, he had a spectacular 8 ¼-length victory in Bertram F. Bongard Stakes. The son of Take Charge Indy out of Rainbow's Song by Unbridled's Song had three victories, three seconds and one third in eight starts, earning \$319,000.

A victory in the Empire Distaff Stakes sent G and A Racing Stable's four-year-old filly Know It All Audrey over a half-million dollars in earnings. The daughter of Shackleford out of Know It All Anna by Midnight Lute, trained by Oscar S. Barrera III, has seven victories, five seconds and three thirds in 25 career starts, good for \$505,612 in earnings.

Michael Dubb, Madaket Stables and Richard Schermehorn's four-year-old gelding Spirit of St. Louis put an exclamation point on an outstanding first season of racing by taking the Mohawk Stakes. The son of Medaglia d'Oro out of the Lemon Drop Kid mare Khancord Kid was bred by Chester and Mary Broman. After a powerful 8 ½-length maiden victory in his debut, he finished second and first twice in allowance company before finishing second by a length and a half to City Man in the West Point Handicap and then winning the Ashley T. Cole Stakes and the Mohawk. His five victories and two seconds in seven lifetime starts have earned his owners \$370,650.

Mark Anderson's four-year-old gray filly Sterling Silver has blossomed into a star for trainer Tom Albertrani. The daughter of Cupid out of Sheet Humor by Distorted Humor, bred by Mallory and Karen Mort, finished first by four lengths but was disqualified and placed second in the Grade 2 Gallant Bloom Stakes at Aqueduct pm October 1st before winning the Iroquois Stakes on Showcase Day. She is now six-for-19 with three seconds, three thirds and earnings of \$661,988.

The highlight of the year for the three Showcase Days is the \$250,000 Empire Classic. Laura Barrish's four-year-old gray gelding Straight Arrow was making his stakes debut off a nine-length allowance victory, and he got the job done. Bred by Patricia Generazio, the son of Arrogate out of Lulu's Number by Numerous has won four of eight starts with one second and \$300,000 in earnings.

New York Stallion Stakes Series

New York-breds by New York stallions get another whole series of stakes races throughout the year, capped by the rich final events.

On April 22nd and 23rd at Aqueduct, a pair of \$200,000 Stallion Stakes for three-year-olds, the Times Square Division and the Park Avenue Division, went to DJ Stable's colt **Lifetime of Chance** and Lady Shelia Stable and Pure Vida Investment's filly **Les Bon Temps**, respectively.

Destiny Oaks of Ocala bred Lifetime of Chance, a son of The Lieutenant out of Janetsticketstocats by Storm Cat who is trained by Mark Casse and has two wins, three seconds and two thirds in ten career starts, for earnings of \$270,807. Southern Equine Stables bred Les Bon Temps, a daughter of Laoban out of Winsanity by Tapizar

who is trained by Linda Rice. She is four-for-11 lifetime with one second, three thirds and earnings of \$610,010.

There were two three-year-old Stallion Stakes on June 18th at Belmont Park, each worth \$150,000. Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and Peter and Patty Searles' gelding **Ramblin' Wreck** captured the Spectacular Bid Division for trainer Danny Gargan.

Ron Bowden bred the son of Redesdale out of Dakota Kid by Lemon Drop Kid, who subsequently won the Rick Violette Stakes via disqualification and has career numbers of three victories and two seconds in 10 starts, for earnings of \$341,060.

J and N Stables' homebred filly **Mz Big Bucks**, co-bred by Elizabeth Jameson, took the Cupecoy's Joy Division of the Stallion Stakes Series. Michelle Nevins trains the daughter of War Dancer out of Frivolous Buck by Lemon Drop Kid. Mz Big Bucks is now two-for-six with one third and earnings of \$150,550.

Saratoga's \$150,000 Stallion Stakes Series races on July 19th and 20th for three-year-olds were taken by owner/trainer William Morey's filly **Orange Freeze** and Hilly Field Stable's colt **Itsallcomintogetha**, trained by Phil Serpe.

Orange Freeze, a daughter of Freud out of Hoopskirt by Birdstone who was bred by Thummp's Racing Stable, won the Statue of Liberty Division of the Series and has two victories, two seconds and one third from nine career starts, for earnings of \$161,405. Itsallcomintogetha, a son of Weekend Hideaway out of Ladywell Court by Powerscourt (GB), captured the Cab Calloway Division of the Series. He has two wins, a second and three thirds from nine career starts, for earnings of \$189,250.

On December 3rd at Aqueduct, Reddam Racing's five-year-old gelding **Today's Flavor** brought impressive credentials into the \$125,000 Thunder Rumble Division of the New York Stallion Stakes Series for three-year-olds and up. He'd won two stakes, the open Belmont Turf and the restricted Affirmed Success, and finished fourth in both the Grade 2 True North and the Grade 1 Carter Handicap. He didn't disappoint, adding the Thunder Rumble to his resume. Bred by Joseph Calvo, the son of Laoban out of Evangelical by Speightstown has posted eight victories and three seconds in 16 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$545,080.

The culmination of the New York Stallion Stakes Series on December 16th at Aqueduct offered two \$500,000 purses for two-year-old fillies and two-year-old colts and geldings.

Shea D Boys Stable's filly **My Shea D Lady** captured the Fifth Avenue Division of the Series for trainer Carlos David. McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds bred My Shea D Lady, a daughter of that farm's stallion Solomini out of Ladyberg by Teuflesberg who has earned \$336,500 in her career from two victories and one third in five starts. "My Shea D Lady was my absolute favorite foal," Joe McMahon said after the race.

The Great White Way Division of the Series went to Michael Imperio, Robert Cotrone, Hibiscus Stables and trainer Rudy Rodriguez's colt **Antonio of Venice**. The son of Laoban out of Stella Performance by Trappe Shot has won two of six career starts with one second, one third and earnings of \$350,744.

Final New York-Bred Stakes of 2023

On December 28th at Aqueduct, thanks to an outstanding job by trainer David Donk, Alifyfe Racing's four-year-old filly **Fingal's Cave** captured the \$100,000 Bay Ridge Stakes off a massive 432-day layoff. Yet another star bred by Chester and Mary Broman, Fingal's Cave is a daughter of Carpe Diem out of Barbie On a Budget by Mineshaft. Fingal's Cave has already carved out an outstanding career in five starts, with four victories and one second, good for \$370,500 in earnings.

The following day at Aqueduct, Michael Dubb and Michael Caruso's five-year-old gelding **Dr Ardito** captured the \$100,000 Alex M. Robb Stakes. Bred by Fred W. Hertrich III and John D. Fielding and trained by Chad Brown, the son of Liam's Map out of Delightfully So by Indian Charlie has eight victories and two seconds in 14 starts. He's earned \$496,993 – yet another successful New York-bred with six-figure earnings.

State & Regional Comparisons

Background of Handle

Everything done at the state and regional levels must be considered against the backdrop of handle, which supports purses and everything that flows from them.

According to data released by Equibase, handle in 2023 fell by 3.7% from the 2022 total.

In 2023, \$11.66 billion was wagered compared to \$12.11 billion in 2022, and there were 5.1% fewer races conducted in 2023 than in the preceding year. The decline in the number of races run helps to paint a rosier picture of the year's handle total, as wagering per race was up 1.5% year over year. In general, however, racing continues to experience contraction in all venues other than Kentucky, where purses are fueled by Historical Horse Racing slot machines at multiple venues. However, the January 11, 2024 issue of Legal Sports Report suggests that the horse betting market in 2023 was "worse than it looks." Two reasons are cited for this: the growing popularity of sports betting, which is a \$100-billion-per-year industry; and the tremendous growth in computer-assisted wagering. CAW is used by high-dollar players who can automatically place large bets in the final seconds before the gates open. Some racing proponents would like to see tracks prevent CAW wagers from being placed for at least two minutes before post time to reduce the disadvantage to those who are not using CAW. Further, the newly created National Thoroughbred Alliance points out that handle is down 50% over the past 20 years when adjusted for inflation.

New York

Let's start with the "gold standard" among state and regional programs: New York. A bright spot for NY-breds was the fact that NYRA put up \$32 million in purses for the 514 NY-bred races it conducted during 2023. On the downside, for the fourth year in a row NYRA ran fewer than the 600 NY-bred races it had pledged to run when it signed a franchise extension in September 2008. NYRA maintains that the reduction can be blamed on a smaller horse population from which to draw starters and does not reflect a lack of respect for NY-breds, which account for approximately 52% of the starters at NYRA tracks.

The public showed its support for NYRA racing products in 2023, as it reported a total of more than \$2.2 billion from all-sources wagering. That figure represents a 5-percent decline from the total for the previous year. NYRA's flagship Saratoga meet saw a year-to-year decline in handle that can be largely attributed to the rainy weather from mid-July through Labor Day that caused multiple turf races to experience heavy scratches when the races were moved to the dirt track. Horseplayers wagered nearly \$800 million on the Saratoga meet in 2023, down from the \$878.2 million wagered in 2022.

While the Fund only receives revenue from money wagered on track or through NYRA Bets, these sources noted a 9.2% decrease in handle compared to 2022, with a reported \$266,978,634 wagered on 201 race days, compared to NYRA's overall 5% decline.

A combined total of more than \$40 million in purse money was offered for NY-breds at NYRA and Finger Lakes Gaming and Racing.

In 2023, the attractive purses coupled with incentives provided by New York's Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund continued to make the New York program the envy of other states. The Fund responded to

increased competition for the broodmares so critical to foal crop size by maintaining the changes first made to mare residency requirements in late 2020 (details at [NYBreds.com](https://www.nybred.com)) and by allowing more time for mares purchased at auctions abroad to arrive in New York State.

NYRA has scheduled 195 days of racing in 2024, all to be held at Aqueduct or Saratoga as the renovation of Belmont Park continues. The 2024 Belmont Stakes will be held June 8 at Saratoga as part of a four days of racing (June 6-9) to be held upstate.

Here's a look at what some other regions and states are doing to maintain and improve their Thoroughbred breeding programs.

Ontario

Ontario Racing's Thoroughbred Improvement Program strives to increase the quality and value of Ontario-bred race horses. Similar to the New York program, Ontario provides awards to breeders and owners of Ontario-bred horses, as well as the owners of stallions that stand in Ontario. The majority of award money is earned in races conducted in Ontario; however, the TIP does pay awards to Ontario-breds that finish first through third in graded and group stakes anywhere in the world. In 2023, it provided \$300,000 in awards to such stakes winners using a point system related to a race's status as Grade One, Two or Three.

Ontario continues to recruit mares via its Mare Purchase Program by providing a pool of \$800,000 to Ontario residents who purchase mares at public auction outside of Ontario and bring them to the province to foal. The program offers a rebate of 50% of the purchase price (up to \$25,000 CAD) in such cases. No single breeder, partnership, corporation or partnership group can collect more than \$75,000 from this incentive program in any given year.

Indiana

The status of an Indiana-bred begins with the registration of a broodmare to their program, with the requirement that she must be in the state by November 1 of the year prior to foaling. Indiana provides breeder, owner and stallion owner awards. In 2023, it paid out \$21 million in award money. The foal of any mare that misses the November 1 deadline can be made eligible for registration as an Indiana-bred provided that the mare is registered within ten days of foaling and she is bred back to an Indiana stallion.

An encouraging sign for Indiana breeders is that Horseshoe Indianapolis increased its handle by 45% year over year in 2023.

Kentucky

We generally don't think of Kentucky as a regional market due to its dominant position as the true Thoroughbred breeding capital of the U.S. Because Kentucky will not post its annual handle and purse figures for 2023 until January 31, 2024, we will have to draw inferences about the year from interim reports. As of November 2023, total wagering in Kentucky was up 4.2% compared to the corresponding date in 2022, thus bucking the trends seen in most other regions last year (with Horseshoe Indianapolis, as mentioned above, being another exception.)

The revenue created by VLTs pegged to Historical Horseracing are creating runaway revenue that's fueling huge purses at the state's five tracks: Churchill Downs, Ellis Park and Turfway Park, each owned by Churchill Downs International, as well as Kentucky Downs and Keeneland Racecourse. The average purse for a race in Kentucky in 2023 was \$107,817.

The purse hikes and handle increases came despite the fact that Churchill Downs had to revamp its turf course and, as a result, switch turf races to the dirt track. In addition, a spate of breakdowns on the dirt track during the year necessitated some race days at the track to be switched to Ellis Park.

Historical Horse Racing (HHR) has been legal for three years, and it protects the generous revenue stream that allows Kentucky to offer the richest daily purse structure in the nation. HHR is also praised for contributing billions to the state's economic development, agribusiness and tourism.

Maryland

The Maryland Horse Breeders Association is keeping in place incentives launched within the past couple of years to lure mare owners to Maryland farms and the courts of the state's stallions.

Since 2022, the MHBA has provided an additional 10% breeder bonus, for a total of 40%, to all Maryland-sired and Maryland-bred maiden winners in the state.

Starting with Maryland-bred foals of 2023, there will also be a tiered breeder bonus system that rewards the state-bred offspring of Maryland sires:

- 35% breeder bonus to Maryland-bred foals sired by a Maryland sire
- 25% breeder bonus to Maryland-breds finishing 1st, 2nd and 3rd in all overnight races

In addition, starting in January 2022 the bonus percentages for all stakes in Maryland (except for those on Maryland Million Day) were increased to 30% for breeder awards and 10% for stallion awards paid for 1st-through 3rd-place finishes.

Pennsylvania

The Pennsylvania breeding program is funded by one-percent of handle. The state's breeding program pays 40% awards to PA-sired PA-breds for 1st- through 3rd-place finishes. This mimics the NY program, which offers double awards to NY-sired award earners.

Pennsylvania allocates up to 12% of slots tax funding to the Race Horse Development Fund, which pays for purses, breeder incentives, drug testing and enforcement activities, according to Education Voters of Pennsylvania. An education group in 2021 commissioned a poll that concluded that taxpayers would prefer to end support for horse racing and breeding, and would prefer to provide free college education at state schools. The PA Equine Coalition points out that support for the industry does not come from tax payers but rather from casinos and track owners. The horse racing industry is estimated to support some 20,000 jobs in the Keystone State.

California

In a nutshell, all is not well for the Thoroughbred industry in the Golden State. Starting with the scheduled June 11, 2024 closing of Golden Gate Fields, reverberations are being felt by breeders and other tracks throughout the state. As interests in the northern part of the state try to keep a circuit going for the more than 1,000 horses that were stabled in 2023 at Golden Gate Fields, they are eyeing fair grounds and a harness track as possible venues for racing.

It turns out that Frank Stronach had great foresight back in 2006, when he realized that Golden Gate Fields' eighty-plus acres on San Francisco Bay were just too valuable to be a permanent home for racing. He tried and failed to set up a track on less-valuable real estate in California, but the locals shot him down. In the meantime, Bay Meadows closed in the north and Hollywood Park closed in the south. Following a feud with his daughter Belinda, Stronach handed off racing interests to her under the TSG banner.

While some feel that the only thing that will revive racing is some kind of gambling money such as that from the VLTs in New York or Historical Horse Racing in Kentucky, that's not likely to happen, as Native American casino interests in California would oppose it.

As this is being written, Santa Anita is unveiling a presumably safer Tapeta racing surface, aftercare facilities are seeing an influx of horses, and broodmares are being shipped to Kentucky with the possibility that they won't go back to California to foal.

Industry observers will be watching this year to see whether owners and trainers will stick around for the lower purses being offered at Santa Anita, which sits on 320 acres of real estate valued at a billion dollars or more, and the hope that some low-level claiming events will be carded for horses displaced from Golden Gate Fields. The foal crop in California (1,314 in 2021 according to the Jockey Club State Fact Book) is currently at the level it was in 1964, and the state's foal total has declined in 18 out of the last 19 years. Despite these clouds over California, their breeder awards remain intact, with breeders collecting more than \$4 million in awards in 2022 (figures are not yet available for 2023). Both the Los Angeles Times (the December 24, 2023 article "California Horse Racing is at a Crossroads - Can it Survive?") and the Thoroughbred Daily News (the December 30, 2023 piece "What Does Next Year Hold for California Horse Racing?") have recently published very informative stories about breeding and racing in California for readers who want to know more about the changing landscape on the west coast.

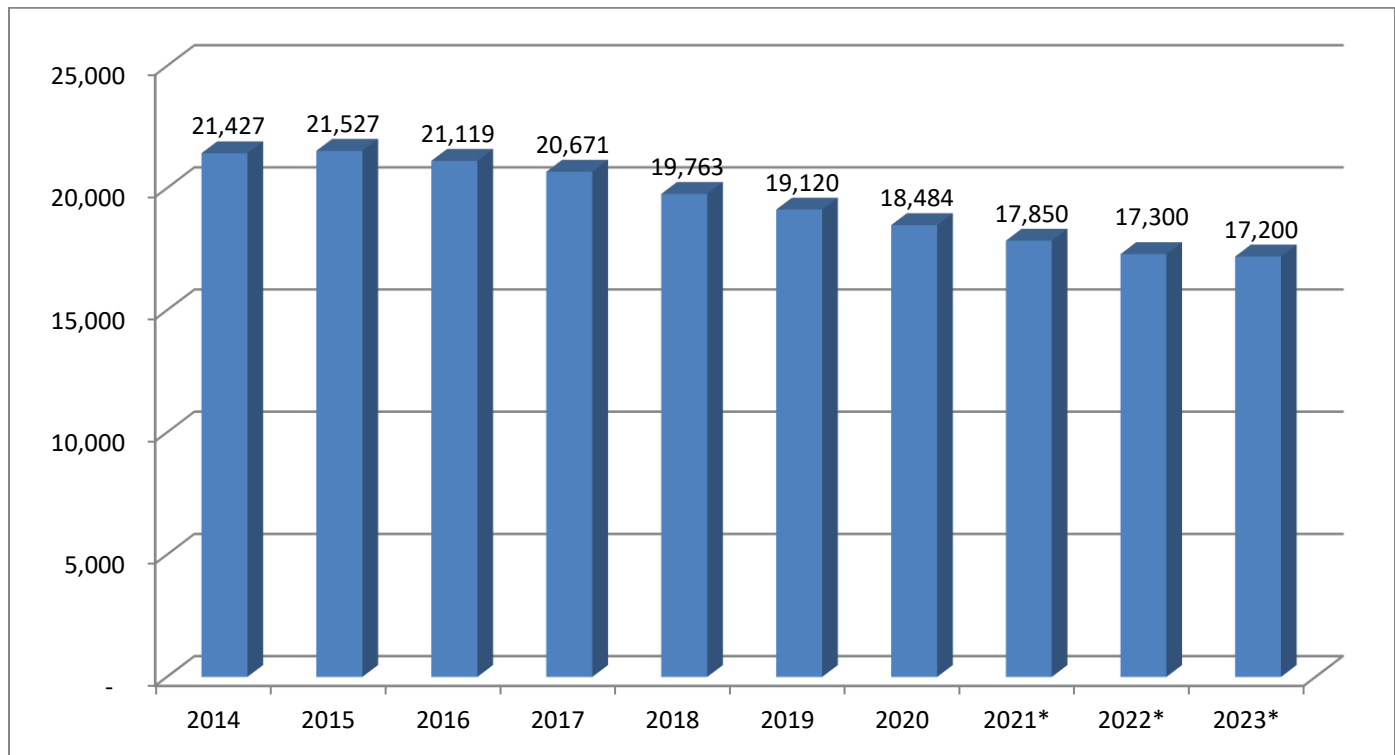

Promotion, Advertising & Aftercare Report

The goal of the Breeding Fund's promotion and advertising spends is to encourage people to buy, breed and race NY-breds. We also want the public to understand that we provide financial support for Thoroughbreds when they leave the racetrack for sanctuary homes or second careers. We have budget limitations on what can be spent on promotion, so we target equine-centric media to spread the word. The Fund's largest promotional contract of \$125,000 is with the New York Racing Association; Fund commercials and promotional stories are aired at NYRA tracks and across the country via Fox Sports coverage during the Spring, Summer and Fall meets.

It's prestigious for our programs to be touted at NYRA tracks and on NYRA broadcasts because NYRA truly is as it describes itself: "the cornerstone of New York State's horse racing industry, which is responsible for 19,000 jobs and more than \$3 billion in annual economic impact."

The Fund's Executive Director works with a certified MWBE company, Pilot Girl Productions, to shoot videos of registered NY stallions and create stories that highlight some of the state's outstanding farms, breeders, owners and aftercare facilities. These stories can be seen by millions via the exposure they receive as a result of NYRA's relationship with Fox Sports.

Starting in 2023, Fox Sports cemented its eight-year deal with NYRA by acquiring the exclusive media rights for the Belmont Stakes, the final jewel of Thoroughbred racing's Triple Crown. Because Belmont Park is undergoing a major renovation, the Belmont and dozens of stakes races that make up the Belmont Festival will all be conducted at the Saratoga Racecourse in both 2024 and 2025, and possibly beyond that if the renovation is not yet complete. Additionally, NYRA Bets was granted the title sponsorship of the Belmont Stakes and Belmont Festival races such that the Belmont will be called the NYRA Bets Belmont Stakes. Further, wagers placed through NYRA Bets are treated as on-track handle, which benefits the NYS Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund directly as it receives a share of on-track bets but not simulcast wagers. Further, Fox Sports will also exclusively provide coverage of the Travers Stakes. Fox Sports has acquired a 25% share in the NYRA Bets gaming platform, so announcers on its broadcasts frequently recommend that viewers download the NYRA Bets app. In other words, the broadcasts show the pageantry of racing but also tout the fun of responsible wagering on races.

Our stories promote the positive aspects of breeding and racing. The money we spend promoting aftercare helps make sure we maintain an agreeable profile among those within the aftercare facilities' circle of influence. In return, when we are faced with challenging situations such as mares being sent to questionable auctions, the aftercare facilities help us make sure the Thoroughbreds are provided safe landings. The Fund acts on the assumption that increasingly the public will not support the industry unless it witnesses the industry standing firmly behind the horses that it breeds and races.

In 2023, the Fund recognized trainer Jena Antonucci as a Champion of Aftercare during its aftercare event at the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in September. The trainer of Belmont and Travers winner Arcangelo has supported responsible retirement throughout her career. Antonucci is encouraging the industry to transition from labeling every horse a rescue (because it reflects negatively on the sport) and instead to recognize ex-racehorses for the potential they bring to their next career in the show ring, on riding trails or at polo fields.

In 2023, the Fund spent \$159,550 with aftercare facilities. That brought Fund support for aftercare in New York State to \$1,095,265 since we made our first spends in 2011. We see this support as fulfilling the promise we make to horses when we teach them to trust us, whether stepping onto a trailer ramp, walking into a starting gate or galloping full speed over a racetrack. The promise is we will make sure the track surface is safe, we will make sure you have a useful career in the breeding shed or show ring, or we will make sure you will live comfortably in sanctuary care when you leave the track.

Advertising dollars in 2023 were also spent promoting the benefits NY-breds receive as a result of the awards provided by the NY Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund, the opportunities to race in restricted state-bred races offering purses enhanced by purse enrichment provided by the Fund, and ads to spread the word about new mare residency rules aimed at recruiting quality mares to the state.

Print ads promoted outstanding performances by NY-breds and educated breeders about the new more-permissive mare residency rules and about the new increased rates for breeder awards.

The Fund supported the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame outreach to the public and to children in particular.

Also, the Fund spent promotional money with the New York Chapter of the Racetrack Chaplaincy to assist its mentoring programs for teens and to help provide summer camp experiences for the children of backstretch workers.

Additionally, the Fund supported Unbridled Thoroughbred Foundation and Equine Rescue Resource based on their assistance in saving Thoroughbreds from so called “kill pens” that advertise that horses will be sent to slaughter facilities if the animals aren’t purchased within a certain time frame.

The Fund’s largest annual contract (\$400,000) is with the Saratoga Springs-based trade and membership group New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc., which represents breeders in New York State. NYTB, Inc. is allowed to lobby lawmakers on behalf of the state’s Thoroughbred industry. The contract was awarded after a Request

for Information was posted through the state's contract system and the Board decided that NYTB, Inc. was best suited to support the Fund's mission.

NYTB also hosts a website (NYTBreeders.org) that compliments the Fund's website (NYBreds.com). The NYTB promotional write-up can be found on pages 113 to 119 of this report.

The Fund recognizes that, in addition to mailing out award checks, it has a responsibility to keep those who have already invested in Thoroughbreds informed about equine health issues and any changes in rules affecting NY-breds. Therefore, we communicate as directly as possible by posting important information on our website (NYBreds.com) and on the Fund's official Facebook page (NYBreds), as well as by sending out e-mails and including information with the letters that accompany award checks.

Naturally, we also handle phone calls and e-mails on a daily basis, and the Executive Director meets directly with breeders at stallion shows and educational events.



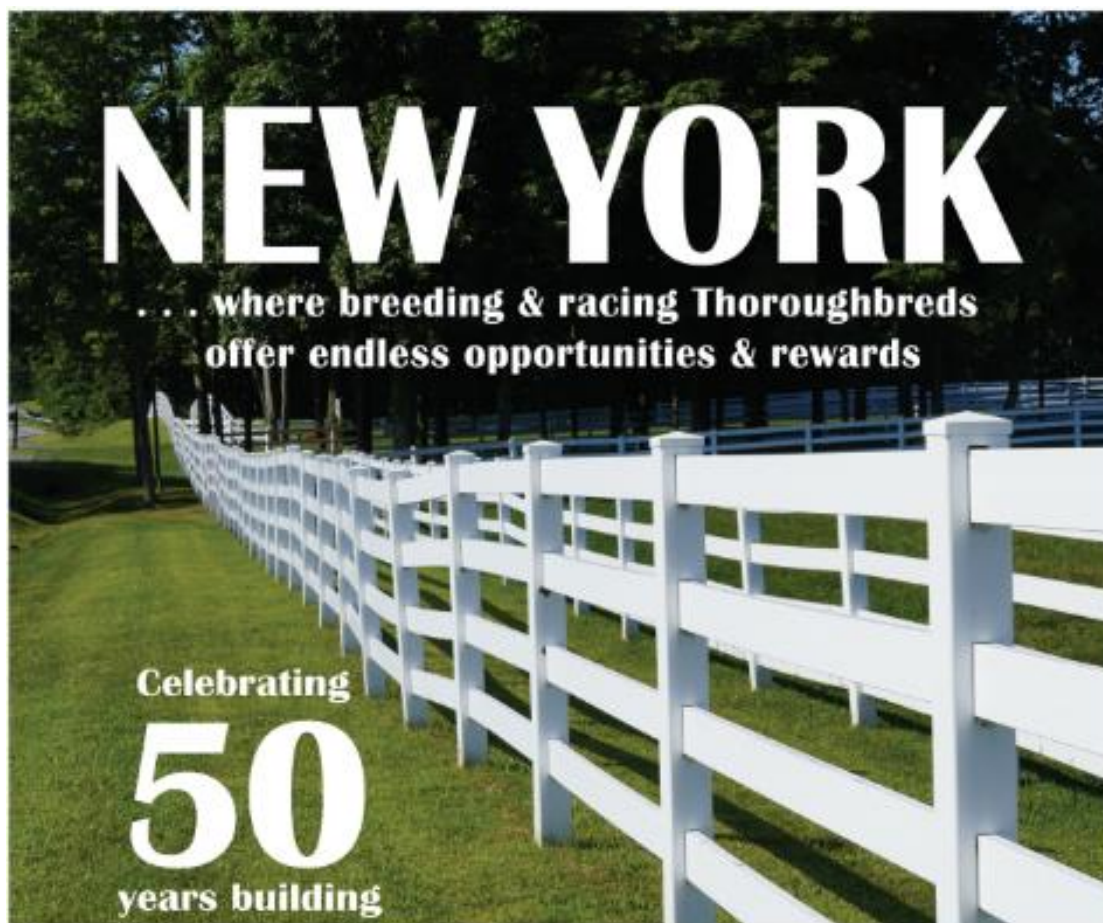

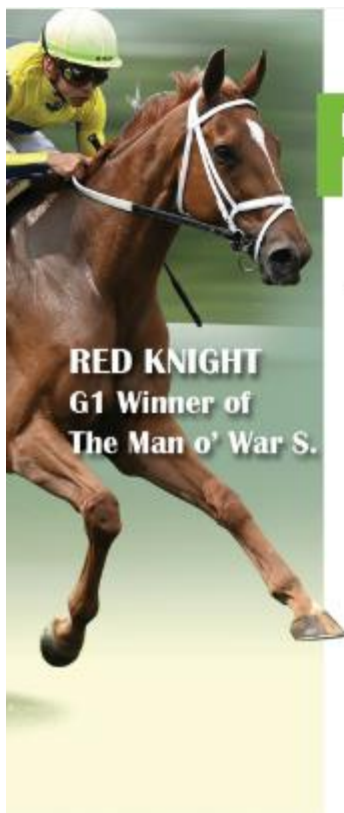

BREEDER AWARD RATE INCREASES FOR NEW YORK-BREDS IN 2024

SCHENECTADY, N.Y. (Tuesday, December 19, 2023) — At the December 12, meeting of The New York State Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund Corporation (the Fund) Board of Directors, a motion was unanimously approved to increase the breeder award rates for all New York-breds who compete in New York starting January 1, 2024.

The increase in breeder awards was approved by the Fund board due to projected revenue increases expected by the Fund in 2024. An increased holdback rate from 10 percent to 15 percent will also be implemented to ensure the Fund can payout awards up to the new advertised rates. We anticipate being able to pay the holdback in its entirety upon completion of the fiscal year.

Program Offers Endless Opportunity & Incentives

"These bigger better bonuses reward breeders for crossing quality race horses," said Tracy Egan, "Board Chairman Brian O'Dwyer encouraged the Board to find a way to get award money out the door to award earners as quickly as possible and by hiking breeder awards, we will do that."

"This historic increase in breeder awards is monumental news for all breeders currently participating in the New York-bred program. It's another reason why New York remains the top regional state-bred program in the nation and why more breeders should bring their mares to foal in New York," said New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive Najia Thompson.

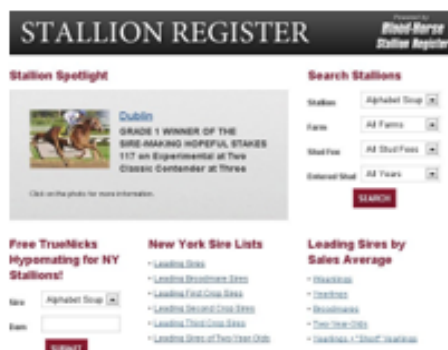
New York Stallion Register

NY Breeder Magazine

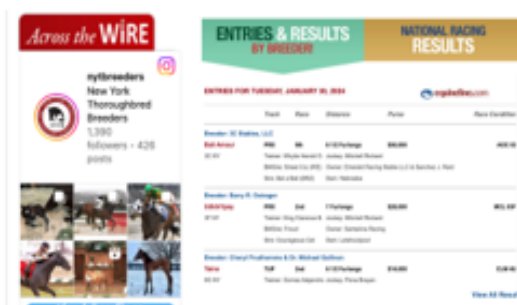


NYTB produces 12 issues of the New York Breeder in print and e-readable online format, annually.

NYTB facilitates a yearly educational seminar for its membership and the NY-Breeding community focused on improving horsemanship, veterinary care, and the quality of NY-bred produced and foaled in New York State. The seminar is held at the Fasig-Tipton Sales grounds and is routinely receives over 150 registered guests, annually.

Next Generation Outreach
